Action

I Application from Hon Jeremy TAM Man-ho to re-join the Subcommittee

The Chairman referred members to the application from Mr Jeremy TAM on 20 March 2017 requesting to re-join the Subcommittee, and invited them to consider the application. Members considered and accepted Mr TAM's application.

Discussion

2. The Subcommittee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at **Appendix**).

Motions

3. At 4:27 pm, the Chairman informed the Subcommittee that she had received five motions from Dr YIU Chung-yim, Mr Andrew WAN, Mr SHIU Ka-chun, Mr HUI Chi-fung and Dr KWOK Ka-ki. Members had no objection to the Subcommittee proceeding with the motions. The Chairman invited the five members to speak on their motions in turn.

4. Dr YIU Chung-yim spoke on his motion. The terms of the motion were as follows –

"本委員會建議政府設立種子基金予非牟利團體作申請墟市及社區經濟之用，以推動墟市及社區經濟的長遠發展。"

(Translation)

"This Subcommittee proposes that the Government set up for non-profit-making organizations a seed fund dedicated to bazaar applications and community economy with a view to promoting the long-term development of bazaars and community economy."

5. The Chairman put Dr YIU's motion to vote. The majority of members present at the meeting voted for the motion. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

Action

6. Mr Andrew WAN spoke on his motion. The terms of the motion were as follows –

"本委員會建議，就著地政總署遞交的閒置土地列表及團體過往曾成功舉辦墟市的地點，即時展開地區諮詢及深入研究，以配合墟市的長遠發展。"

(Translation)

"This Subcommittee proposes that local consultation and in-depth study be immediately carried out with regard to the list of vacant land submitted by the Lands Department and the locations where bazaars were successfully held in the past by organizations to cater for the long-term development of bazaars. "

7. The Chairman put Mr WAN's motion to vote. The majority of members present at the meeting voted for the motion. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

8. Mr SHIU Ka-chun spoke on his motion. The terms of the motion were as follows –

"本委員會動議政府善用閒置街市，作社區廚房之用，以避免繁複的牌照申請，真正做到給街坊租用或借用製作食物，在墟市或街市擺賣，讓無資本的街坊，可透過社區廚房發揮自己的才能。"

(Translation)

" This Subcommittee moves that the Government should optimize the use of idle markets by putting them to use as community kitchens, so that kaifongs can rent or borrow the premises to prepare food to be sold at bazaars or markets without the need to go through the complicated licence application procedures, hence kaifongs with no access to capital can unleash their talent through community kitchens. "

9. The Chairman put Mr SHIU's motion to vote. The majority of members present at the meeting voted for the motion. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

Action

10. Mr HUI Chi-fung spoke on his motion. The terms of the motion were as follows –

"本委員會建議政府應主動進行研究，以及作地區諮詢，收集全港市民對設立熟食墟市的意見，並探討各項可行措施。"

(Translation)

"This Subcommittee proposes that the Government should proactively conduct studies and carry out local consultation to collect the views of the people of Hong Kong on the establishment of cooked food bazaars and explore various feasible initiatives."

11. The Chairman put Mr HUI's motion to vote. The majority of members present at the meeting voted for the motion. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

12. Dr KWOK Ka-ki spoke on his motion. The terms of the motion were as follows –

"(一) 本委員會促請政府在全港 18 個區議會分區設立「區區有墟市」的政策，並訂立短中長期的墟市計劃，可供團體申請營辦墟市的地點及相關配套措施。

(二) 本委員會建議簡化墟市申請機制，例如食物環境衛生署作為墟市統籌，及由各區民政事務專員配合，主動協調各政府部門(包括但不限於地政總署、消防署、房屋署、康樂及文化事務署等)處理十八區墟市申請，制定一套具體簡易的申請機制，一站式處理墟市申請與營辦。

(三) 本委員會建議政府當局成立種子基金予非牟利團體申請，以推動墟市發展。"

(Translation)

"(i) This Subcommittee urges the Government to develop a policy of establishing a bazaar for each of the 18 District Council districts in Hong Kong, and set out short, medium and long-term plans for bazaars, venues available for organizations to apply for bazaar operation and relevant complementary measures.

Action

(ii) This Subcommittee suggests streamlining the bazaar application mechanism, such as the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department acting as a coordinator for bazaars under the support of the District Officers and taking the initiative to coordinate with various government departments (including but not limited to the Lands Department, Fire Services Department, Housing Department, Leisure and Cultural Services Department) in handling the bazaar applications from the 18 districts, and developing a specific and simplified application mechanism for handling the applications and operation of bazaars in a one-stop manner.

(iii) This Subcommittee proposes that the Administration set up a seed fund for application by non-profit-making organizations to promote the development of bazaars."

13. The Chairman put Dr KWOK's motion to vote. The majority of members present at the meeting voted for the motion. The Chairman declared the motion passed.

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration

14. The Administration was requested to provide information on:

Measures to facilitate the setting up of bazaars

(a) the Administration's response to Subcommittee members' suggestions as follows:

(i) the Administration should simplify the current application procedures and develop a comprehensive guidelines to facilitate the public in making applications for setting up bazaars (the guidelines should include the procedures for obtaining permission from the relevant departments in charge of different types of venues, the licences/permits required for the activities concerned, and the role and functions of the District Councils in vetting different types of bazaar proposals);

(ii) the Administration should set up a designated office (making reference to the one set up for the food truck pilot scheme) for co-ordinating bazaar applications in all districts and providing one-stop services to project proponents during the process;

Action

- (iii) instead of the list of vacant land for greening/community uses compiled by the Lands Department, the Administration should develop a list of sites over the territory suitable for setting up bazaars taking into account factors like the location, size, conditions and visitor flow of the sites;
- (iv) the Administration should conduct a territory-wide consultancy study on the feasibility of developing bazaars in different districts and consult the local community for views on related issues;

Organization of bazaars in public rental housing estates and venues managed by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department or Home Affairs Department

- (b) the conditions under which the Housing Department ("HD") would provide venues in public rental housing ("PRH") estates for organizing commercial activities with cash transactions;
- (c) the terms and conditions of the land leases or deed of mutual covenants requiring HD to obtain consent from other owners for setting up bazaars in common areas of PRH estates;
- (d) the Administration's response to Subcommittee members' views that:
 - (i) bazaars established in venues managed by HD, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department ("LCSD") and the Home Affairs Department should allow commercial activities with money transactions in principle, and only under special circumstances should bazaar organizers be required to seek prior approval from the relevant departments for such activities;
 - (ii) relaxing the stringent requirements adopted by LCSD in vetting applications for using leisure venues for setting up bazaars; and

- (e) the Administration's response to the five motions passed at the meeting.
