Action

I. Implementation and review of the Race Discrimination Ordinance [LC Paper Nos. CB(2)211/17-18(01) to (03) and CB(2)228/17-18(01)]

<u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex** I).

Follow-up actions required of the Administration and the Equal Opportunities Commission

# Admin 2. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to:

:

(a) consider taking forward the Equal Opportunities Commission's ("EOC") recommendations which were considered by EOC to be of higher priority under the Discrimination Law Review ("DLR") relating to the Race Discrimination Ordinance ("RDO"), including:

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- (i) to amend RDO by providing that it is unlawful for the Government to discriminate in performing its functions or exercising its powers (DLR recommendation 6);
- (ii) to repeal the provisions regarding vocational training and education in relation to modifying or making different arrangements for medium of instruction under sections 20(2) and 26(2) of RDO (DLR recommendations 9 and 10); and
- (iii) to follow up on the recommendation that protection from discrimination on grounds of nationality and citizenship should be provided under RDO (DLR recommendation 24); and
- (b) relay the following views raised by members to the Education Bureau:
  - (i) teaching materials and curriculum on learning Chinese as a second language should be provided for use by teachers; and
  - (ii) equal opportunities should be safeguarded for ethnic minorities ("EMs") in vocational training and education. In particular, more vocational training programmes should be conducted in English to cater for the non-Chinese speakers.

### EOC 3. EOC undertook that it would:

- (a) provide information on the recommendations that EOC had made to Government departments and public bodies for enhancing the rights and well-being of ethnic minorities and the response of the Government departments/public bodies concerned to those recommendations; and
- (b) relay the Deputy Chairman's view that disaggregated data on the ethnicities of their patients should be kept by the Hospital Authority for service planning purposes.

#### Motions

4. <u>The Chairman</u> put the three motions moved by Mr SHIU Ka-chun, Dr Fernando CHEUNG and Ms Claudia MO respectively (wording of the motions at **Annex II**) to vote. Members present unanimously voted for the motions. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the three motions were passed.

Admin 5. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to provide a written response to the three motions.

(<u>Post-meeting note</u>: The Administration provided a written response to the three motions on 6 December 2017 [LC Paper No. CB(2)493/17-18].)

Clerk 6. <u>The Clerk</u> was requested to revise the proposed meeting schedule for members' consideration.

  - (a) review of the Administrative Guidelines on Promotion of Racial Equality;
  - (b) provision of teaching materials and curriculum on learning Chinese as a second language for use by teachers;
  - (c) services and measures to address the issue of domestic violence among EM families;
  - (d) restrictions applied by schools on religious garments worn by students and the provision of school meals fulfilling religious dietary requirements; and
  - (e) issues related to EM women (including poverty and employment difficulties).

<u>The Deputy Chairman</u> proposed that to facilitate deputations' attendance, the subjects to be discussed at the future meetings should be decided as early as possible. <u>The Chairman</u> requested the Clerk to follow up.

8. <u>Members</u> agreed that the next meeting would be held on Monday, 11 December 2017, at 4:30 pm to discuss the provision of venues in districts for EMs to conduct religious and cultural activities with deputations and the Administration.

Ms MO said that as mentioned in Hong Kong Unison's submission [LC Paper No. CB(2)228/17-18(01)], the court held that the acts of the Police in investigation and arrest did not amount to "services" for the purpose of RDO and policing was not bound by RDO. Mr SHIU Ka-chun also expressed concern that, unlike the other three anti-discrimination ordinances, RDO did not have a provision to ensure that there was protection from discrimination in relation to various Government functions and powers exercised by the Government.  The Administration explained that RDO was binding on the Government and it prohibited discriminatory acts and practices in the areas specified in RDO. At the present stage, the Administration sought to focus on taking forward the nine prioritized recommendations under DLR first, and it would follow up on the remaining recommendations at a later stage. In the meantime, the Administration continued to safeguard the equal rights of people with different ethnic origins, and enhance the sensitivity among Government staff serving ethnic minorities ("EMs") through education and publicity as well as the application of the Administrative Guidelines on Promotion of Racial Equality ("the Administrative Guidelines"). |                 |  |

Given that the existing Race Discrimination Ordinance ("RDO") is full of loopholes and fails to provide ethnic minorities with full protection, and that the threshold for substantiating complaints of racial discrimination is extremely high, this Subcommittee requests the Government to amend RDO by providing that apart from the provision of services, it is also unlawful for the Government to discriminate in performing its functions and exercising its powers, such that when the Government performs its functions and exercises its powers, people of different ethnic groups will be protected from racial discrimination.
