# Legislative Council <br> Panel on Constitutional Affairs 

Review of the Number of Elected Seats<br>for the Sixth-Term District Councils

## Purpose

This paper briefs Members on the review of the number of elected seats for the sixth-term District Councils ("DCs").

## Background

## Statutory Framework

2. The number of elected seats for each of the 18 DCs is stipulated in Schedule 3 to the District Councils Ordinance ("DCO") (Cap. 547). Under section 8 of the DCO, the Chief Executive in Council may, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council ("LegCo"), amend Schedule 3 by order published in the Gazette. At present, a total of 431 elected seats are specified for the 18 DCs under Schedule 3 to the DCO.
3. Before each DC ordinary election, the Electoral Affairs Commission ("EAC") is required under the Electoral Affairs Commission Ordinance ("EACO") (Cap. 541) to recommend to the Chief Executive the boundaries of District Council Constituency Areas ("DCCAs"). In demarcating the DCCA boundaries, the EAC must follow the criteria laid down in section 20 of the EACO, including the existing boundaries of Districts and the number of elected seats for each DC specified in the DCO (section $20(4 \mathrm{~A})$ and (4B) of the EACO) ${ }^{1}$.
4. It is anticipated that the ordinary election of the sixth-term DCs will be conducted in November 2019. The EAC will have to start considering the DCCA boundaries for the 2019 DC election in the

[^0]beginning of 2018, so that there would be sufficient time for consulting the public, making recommendations to the Chief Executive by the statutory deadline on 21 November 2018, amending the relevant subsidiary legislation and conducting any subsequent preparatory work for the election. According to this work plan, we now need to decide whether it is necessary to adjust the number of elected seats for the 18 DCs first. Any adjustments, if required, will have to be reflected through amending Schedule 3 to the DCO, in which case the relevant amendments have to be passed by the LegCo by end 2017.

## Review for the Sixth-term DCs

5. The population quota ${ }^{2}$ generally reflects the number of residents served by one DC elected member. Since the first-term DCs, the population quota has been maintained at about 17000 . This ratio has been functioning well and we have no intention to change it. Accordingly, we will adopt the existing population quota of 16964 as a starting point for calculating the notional number of elected seats for the sixth-term DCs.
6. The total population of Hong Kong in mid-2019, as derived from the report "Projections of Population Distribution 2015-2024" published in December 2015 by the Working Group on Population Distribution Projections ("WGPD"), will be around 7518900 . This projection is the most up-to-date population distribution projection figures available at the moment. It has come to our attention that the Census and Statistics Department released in end February this year the summary results of the 2016 Population By-census. However, as it is expected that an updated set of population distribution projections by 18 districts for mid-2019 based on the 2016 Population By-census results will only be available by December this year the earliest, it is therefore impossible for the above updated population projection figures to be provided to us in time for this review.
7. That said, we did make reference to the population figures derived from the 2016 Population By-census, and found that by mid-2016, population in seven districts has already exceeded the respective mid-2019 population projections published by the WGPD. While adjustment to be made to the 2019 population projections for these

[^1]districts is uncertain at this stage, the possibility of an upward adjustment for these districts cannot be precluded, given the projected growing trend of the overall population in Hong Kong. In light of the above, and for providing more opportunities for public-spirited individuals to participate in public affairs, we will take a more liberal approach, and recommend to take the greater of (i) population distribution projections in mid-2019 by the WGPD published in December 2015 and (ii) population in mid-2016 derived from the 2016 Population By-census as the base. By applying the population quota of 16964 , the number of elected seats for the sixth-term DCs should be 447 (see column B of Annex A). As per the calculation results, ten DCs (including Sham Shui Po, Kowloon City, Kwun Tong, Yau Tsim Mong, Kwai Tsing, Tsuen Wan, Tuen Mun, Yuen Long, Sha Tin and Sai Kung) should have their number of elected seats increased; three DCs (including Wan Chai, Eastern, and Southern) should have their number of elected seats reduced; the remaining five (including Central and Western, Wong Tai Sin, North, Tai Po and Islands) should have their number of elected seats unchanged.
8. We are mindful that the abolition of DC appointed seats since the fifth-term DCs has reduced the opportunities for political parties/groups or individuals to participate in public affairs and increase the workload of the remaining DC members in shouldering their important role in district administration. For this reason, we recommend that reference be made to the arrangement in the fifth-term DCs, whereby the number of DC elected seats should remain unchanged for those DCs (i.e. Wan Chai, Eastern and Southern DCs) which, in strict accordance with the population distribution projections, should have a reduction in the number of elected seats.
9. To conclude, we recommend modest adjustments based on the population and in accordance with the established methodology be made to the number of elected seats for individual DCs. The changes recommended are summarised as follows:-
(a) an increase in the number of elected seat by one for Kowloon City, Yau Tsim Mong and Tsuen Wan DCs respectively;
(b) an increase in the number of elected seats by two for Sham Shui Po, Kwai Tsing, Tuen Mun and Sai Kung DCs respectively;
(c) an increase in the number of elected seats by three for Kwun Tong and Sha Tin DCs respectively;
(d) an increase in the number of elected seats by four for Yuen Long DC; and
(e) no change to the number of elected seats in the Central and Western, Wan Chai, Eastern, Southern, Wong Tai Sin, North, Tai Po and Islands DCs.

The above adjustments entail a net increase of 21 elected seats overall, on top of the 431 elected seats for the fifth-term DCs. As a result, the population quota will fall slightly to 16785 , but will still be close to the level of 17000 . The numbers of elected seats for the first to the fifth-term DCs and the recommended number of elected seats for the sixth-term DCs are set out in Annex B. The composition of the sixth-term DCs reflecting the above recommendations is at Annex $\mathbf{C}$ (i.e. with a total of 452 elected seats and 27 ex officio seats).

## TIMETABLE

10. We will brief the Chairmen and Vice Chairmen of the 18 DCs on 10 July 2017. After considering the views of the DCs and LegCo, we will submit to the LegCo in due course the subsidiary legislation to implement the recommendations on the increase of elected seats. Subject to LegCo's approval, the EAC will, as mentioned in paragraph 3, draw up the recommendations on the demarcation of the DCCA boundaries for the 2019 DC Election in accordance with the statutory criteria (including the number of elected seats for each DC as stipulated in the DCO ).

## ADVICE SOUGHT

11. Members are invited to note and give their views on the recommendations regarding the increase of elected seats set out in paragraph 9.

[^0]:    1 Section 20(1) of the EACO also requires that the population size of DCCAs should be as near the "population quota" as practicable, and that deviation from the population quota should be within $25 \%$. Section $20(5)$ allows the EAC to depart from the strict application of section $20(1)$, if the EAC considers such a departure necessary or desirable having regard to factors of "community identities and the preservation of local ties; and physical features such as size, shape, accessibility and development of the relevant area or any part thereof". This being the case, any deviation from the population quota exceeding $25 \%$ must be justified in the EAC's report to the Chief Executive (section 18(1A) of the EACO).

[^1]:    ${ }^{2}$ It is stipulated in section 17 (b) of the EACO that population quota, in relation to an ordinary election, means the total population of Hong Kong divided by the total number of elected members to be returned in that election.
