Timing for discussion proposed by the Administration

### 1. Hong Kong-Shenzhen Innovation and Technology Park in the Lok Ma Chau Loop

With the concurrence of Hon WU Chi-wai, Chairman of the Panel on Commerce and Industry ("CI Panel"), Hon Tommy CHEUNG Yu-yan, Chairman of the Panel on Development, and Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT, Chairman of the Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting ("ITB Panel"), a joint meeting of the three Panels will be held on 6 March 2017 to discuss with the Administration on the Hong Kong-Shenzhen Innovation and Technology Park in the Lok Ma Chau Loop.

### 2. Policy on re-industrialization and the latest development of the industrial estates and Hong Kong Science Park

The Administration will brief the Panel on the Government's re-industrialization policy, the latest development of the industrial estates ("IEs") and other measures to support re-industrialization. The Administration will also brief members on the implementation progress of Stage 1 of the Science Park Expansion Programme, and other related initiatives of the Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corporation ("HKSTPC"), in particular those relating to re-industrialization.

21 March 2017

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon Charles Peter MOK suggested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the updated progress on the use of land in IEs under the revised IE policy, including the land use policy in relation to the development of data centres. The Administration was also requested to brief members on the latest development of Science Park and the relevant Government's policy initiatives.

# Timing for discussion proposed by the Administration

At the work-plan meeting between the Panel Chairman and Deputy Chairman and Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development ("SCED") and Secretary for Innovation and Technology ("S for IT") on 31 October 2016, the Panel Chairman requested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the Government's re-industrialization policy, as well as the related measures implemented by HKSTPC in IEs and Science Park.

#### 3. Way forward for the Trade Single Window project

The Administration will brief the Panel on the way forward for the proposal to develop a single information and technology platform for the one-stop lodging of all Business-to-Government documents for importing and exporting goods, following a public consultation exercise concluded in July 2016. **April 2017** 

## 4. Progress report on the implementation of the Dedicated Fund on Branding, Upgrading and Domestic Sales and other support measures for small and medium enterprises

The Administration will brief the Panel on the latest implementation progress of the Dedicated Fund on Branding, Upgrading and Domestic Sales, as well as other support measures for small and medium enterprises ("SMEs"), including the initiatives on assisting SMEs in tiding over their liquidity problems.

**April** 2017

At the Panel meeting on 19 April 2016, members requested that the Administration should update the Panel on the support measures for SMEs. Members also requested that representatives of both the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau and the Financial Services and the Treasury Bureau be invited to attend the relevant meeting. At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon CHAN Chun-ying suggested that the subject of enhancing the Small and Medium Enterprises Financing Guarantee Scheme operated by the Hong Kong Mortgage Corporation be discussed.

### 5. Progress on the recent implementation of various new schemes under the Innovation and Technology Fund

The Administration will brief the Panel on the implementation progress of various new schemes under the Innovation and Technology Fund, such as the Enterprise Support Scheme, the Midstream Research Programme for Universities, and the expanded Public Sector Trial Scheme and Internship Programme.

At the Panel meeting on 17 November 2015, members requested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the Belt and Road Initiatives and the business opportunities for Hong Kong.

### 12. Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in Hong Kong

At the Panel meeting on 21 January 2014, the Panel passed a motion moved by Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan on "Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in Hong Kong". The Administration was requested to brief the Panel on the relevant initiatives.

A joint meeting of the Panel on Health Services ("HS Panel") and CI Panel was held on 23 June 2015 to discuss and receive views from deputations on the item "Regulation and development of beauty services". At the Panel meeting on 21 April 2015, Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan requested that this item be retained in the List of outstanding items for discussion ("the List") of the Panel. At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Panel should continue to follow up issues relating to regulation and development of beauty services.

### Timing for discussion proposed by the Administration

At the Panel meeting on 15 November 2016, members noted the Administration's plan for issues related to the use of medical devices commonly used in beauty procedures be discussed at HS Panel, and maintained the view that this item be retained in the List. The subject of "Proposed regulatory framework for medical devices" was discussed at HS Panel on 16 January 2017.

#### 13. Diversified development of industries in Hong Kong

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Administration should brief members on the latest development of the Government's initiatives to promote the diversified development of industries in Hong Kong. Members of the Panel on Economic Development should be invited to attend the relevant meeting for discussion.

#### 14. Progress on the updating of the copyright regime

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon Charles Peter MOK and Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG opined that notwithstanding that the legislative exercise to amend the Copyright Ordinance (Cap. 528) ("CO") as introduced by the Copyright (Amendment) Bill 2014 ("the Bill") could not conclude in the legislative session of 2015-2016, the Administration should brief the Panel on the progress in respect of the updating of the copyright regime. Mr MOK and Dr CHEUNG considered that the Administration should continue to deal with issues raised by stakeholders of the industry and the community during the discussion of the Bill, such as the requests for providing copyright exceptions for digital books under CO or by way of guidelines to address the specific needs of persons with disabilities and dyslexia.
