1. Way forward for the Trade Single Window project

The Administration will brief the Panel on the way forward for the proposal to develop a single information and technology platform for the one-stop lodging of all Business-to-Government documents for importing and exporting goods, following a public consultation exercise concluded in July 2016.

2. Extension and Progress Report on the Dedicated Fund on Branding, Upgrading and Domestic Sales and the special concessionary measures under the SME Financing Guarantee Scheme

The Administration will brief the Panel on the extension of the application period and latest implementation progress of the Dedicated Fund on Branding, Upgrading and Domestic Sales and the special concessionary measures under the SME Financing Guarantee Scheme, as well as other support measures for small and medium enterprises ("SMEs").

At the Panel meeting on 19 April 2016, members requested that the Administration should update the Panel on the support measures for SMEs. Members also requested that representatives of both the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau and the Financial Services and the Treasury Bureau be invited to attend the relevant meeting. At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon CHAN Chun-ying suggested that the subject of enhancing the Small and Medium Enterprises Financing Guarantee Scheme operated by the Hong Kong Mortgage Corporation be discussed.

3. Progress on the recent implementation of various new schemes under the Innovation and Technology Fund

<u>Timing</u> <u>for discussion</u> <u>proposed by the</u> <u>Administration</u>

The subject was raised by Hon Charles Peter MOK at the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016. It was further suggested at the work-plan meeting between Panel Chairman and Deputy Chairman and Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development and Secretary for Innovation and Technology on 31 October 2016 that members of the Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting be invited to join the discussion of the above item at the relevant meeting.

9. The Belt and Road Initiatives

At the Panel meeting on 17 November 2015, members requested To be confirmed that the Administration should brief the Panel on the Belt and Road Initiatives and the business opportunities for Hong Kong.

10. Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in Hong Kong

At the Panel meeting on 21 January 2014, the Panel passed a To be confirmed motion moved by Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan on "Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in Hong Kong". The Administration was requested to brief the Panel on the relevant initiatives.

A joint meeting of the Panel on Health Services ("HS Panel") and the Panel was held on 23 June 2015 to discuss and receive views from deputations on the item "Regulation and development of beauty services". At the Panel meeting on 21 April 2015, Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan requested that this item be retained in the List of outstanding items for discussion ("the List") of the Panel. At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Panel should continue to follow up issues relating to regulation and development of beauty services.

At the Panel meeting on 15 November 2016, members noted the Administration's plan for issues related to the use of medical devices commonly used in beauty procedures be discussed at HS Panel, and maintained the view that this item be retained in the List. The subject of "Proposed regulatory framework for medical devices" was discussed at HS Panel on 16 January 2017.

<u>Timing</u> <u>for discussion</u> <u>proposed by the</u> <u>Administration</u>

At the Panel meeting on 21 February 2017, members agreed to Hon SHIU Ka-fai's proposal to set up a joint subcommittee under the Panel and HS Panel on issues relating to the regulation of devices and development of the beauty industry. HS Panel also agreed to the above proposal at its meeting held on 28 February 2017.

11. Diversified development of industries in Hong Kong

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG To be confirmed suggested that the Administration should brief members on the latest development of the Government's initiatives to promote the diversified development of industries in Hong Kong. Members of the Panel on Economic Development should be invited to attend the relevant meeting for discussion.

12. Progress on the updating of the copyright regime

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon Charles Peter To be confirmed MOK and Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG opined that notwithstanding that the legislative exercise to amend the Copyright Ordinance (Cap. 528) ("CO") as introduced by the Copyright (Amendment) Bill 2014 ("the Bill") could not conclude in the legislative session of 2015-2016, the Administration should brief the Panel on the progress in respect of the updating of the copyright regime. Mr MOK and Dr CHEUNG considered that the Administration should continue to deal with issues raised by stakeholders of the industry and the community during the discussion of the Bill, such as the requests for providing copyright exceptions for digital books under CO or by way of guidelines to address the specific needs of persons with disabilities and dyslexia.
