# 1. Progress on the recent implementation of various new schemes under the Innovation and Technology Fund

The Administration will brief the Panel on the implementation 16 May 2017 progress of various new schemes under the Innovation and Technology Fund, such as the Enterprise Support Scheme, the Midstream Research Programme for Universities, and the expanded Public Sector Trial Scheme and Internship Programme.

2. Progress on the updating of the copyright regime : Copyright 16 May 2017 exceptions for people with a print disability under the "Marrakesh Treaty to Facilitate Access to Published Works for Persons Who Are Blind, Visually Impaired or Otherwise Print Disabled"

The Administration will brief the Panel on the Government's plan to review copyright exceptions currently provided for people with a print disability. Reference will be made to the "Marrakesh Treaty to Facilitate Access to Published Works for Persons Who Are Blind, Visually Impaired or Otherwise Print Disabled".

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Hon Charles Peter Hon Fernando CHEUNG opined MOK and Dr that notwithstanding that the legislative exercise to amend the Copyright Ordinance (Cap. 528) ("CO") as introduced by the Copyright (Amendment) Bill 2014 ("the Bill") could not conclude in the legislative session of 2015-2016, the Administration should brief the Panel on the progress in respect of the updating of the copyright regime. Mr MOK and Dr CHEUNG considered that the Administration should continue to deal with issues raised by stakeholders of the industry and the community during the discussion of the Bill, such as the requests for providing copyright exceptions for digital books under CO or by way of guidelines to address the specific needs of persons with disabilities and dyslexia.

the above item at the relevant meeting.

### 7. Latest position of the testing and certification industry in Hong Kong

The Administration will brief the Panel on the latest position of Hong Kong's testing and certification industry.

At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Hong Kong Council for Testing and Certification should be invited to attend the relevant meeting and brief members on its work.

#### The Belt and Road Initiatives 8.

At the Panel meeting on 17 November 2015, members requested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the Belt and Road Initiatives and the business opportunities for Hong Kong.

#### 9. Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in **Hong Kong**

To be confirmed At the Panel meeting on 21 January 2014, the Panel passed a motion moved by Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan on "Promoting the industrialization of the beauty industry in Hong Kong". The Administration was requested to brief the Panel on the relevant initiatives.

A joint meeting of the Panel on Health Services ("HS Panel") and the Panel was held on 23 June 2015 to discuss and receive views from deputations on the item "Regulation and development of beauty services". At the Panel meeting on 21 April 2015, Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan requested that this item be retained in the List of outstanding items for discussion ("the List") of the Panel. At the Panel meeting on 18 October 2016, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Panel should continue to follow up issues relating to regulation and development of beauty services.

At the Panel meeting on 15 November 2016, members noted the Administration's plan for issues related to the use of medical devices commonly used in beauty procedures be discussed at HS Panel, and maintained the view that this item be retained in the List. HS Panel also agreed to the above proposal at its meeting held on 28 February 2017.
