Follow-up to the meeting on 27 February 2017
Item IV - Hong Kong Tourism Board Work Plan for 2017-18 and
Item V - Update on Hong Kong Disneyland Resort

As requested by Members at the captioned meeting, we would like to provide the following supplementary information for the Panel's reference.

Item IV - Hong Kong Tourism Board Work Plan for 2017-2018

- (a) & (b) "Pilot scheme to promote tourism projects with local characteristics" and "Pilot scheme to promote green tourism"
- 2. In 2017-18, the Government will provide an additional funding of \$12 million and \$5 million for the Hong Kong Tourism Board (HKTB) to launch pilot schemes to promote tourism projects with local characteristics and in-depth green tourism respectively.
- 3. The pilot scheme for promoting tourism products with local characteristics aims to provide funding support, including promotion-related

expenses, to organisers for hosting activities with tourism appeal to showcase Hong Kong's local characteristics. As for the pilot scheme for promoting in-depth green tourism, the Government will provide subsidy to the travel trade for introducing and operating in-depth green tourism products, thus bringing more choices for tourists.

4. The Tourism Commission, in collaboration with the HKTB, will work out the funding criteria and guidelines for the two pilot schemes and will announce the details in due course.

(c) Projection of the visitor arrivals for 2017

- 5. In making a projection of visitor arrivals in 2017, the HKTB has made reference to statistics, macroeconomics indicators and other factors that might affect the number of arrivals, including the following:
- (a) latest trend of visitor arrivals;
- (b) macroeconomic and political situations of major economies and source markets;
- (c) forecast on tourism development made by research institutions such as World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO), Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA); and academic institution such as Hong Kong Polytechnic University;
- (d) exchange rate;
- (e) growth of Gross Domestic Product; and
- (f) aviation capacity.
- 6. Based on the above data, the HKTB has made relevant assumptions and predictions on the development of different source markets, and a preliminary forecast on visitor arrivals in 2017 using linear model, and has also taken into consideration a number of other variable external factors, including the latest global economic and political landscape, changes in visa policies, Mainland's tourism policies, market competition (such as newly-built tourism infrastructure in Hong Kong and other source markets), market environment (such as desire to travel in different source markets), and information related to source markets provided by different stakeholders. Having consolidated all information mentioned above and conducted thorough analysis, the HKTB derived the forecast on visitor arrivals in respect of different source markets before submitting it to the Board for review and approval.
- 7. In November 2016, the HKTB made a preliminary forecast on the visitor arrivals in 2017. Since full-year arrivals in 2016 were not yet available at that time, the HKTB revised the forecast on full-year arrivals in 2017 after

making reference to various data and information in January 2017. In accordance with the established practice, the HKTB will further assess the latest development of individual market in the middle of the year, and revise the visitor arrival forecast if it is deemed necessary. Any revision in forecast will be reported to the Board.

8. During the year, the HKTB will monitor closely the developments in individual source markets, and flexibly adjust its investments and strategies as and when required after consulting the Board.

(d) The categorisation of Mainland arrivals

9. The categories of Mainland visitors in 2016 are tabulated below:
