Action

I. Election of Chairman (and Deputy Chairman)

Election of Chairman

Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung, the member with the highest precedence among those who were present at the meeting, presided over the election of the Chairman of the Subcommittee. He invited nominations for the chairmanship of the Subcommittee.

- 2. Ms Claudia MO was nominated by Mr CHAN Chi-chuen and the nomination was seconded by Dr LAU Siu-lai. Ms Claudia MO accepted the nomination.
- 3. <u>Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung</u> invited other nominations for the chairmanship. Dr CHIANG Lai-wan was nominated by <u>Mr Michael TIEN</u> and the nomination was seconded by <u>Ms Alice MAK</u>. <u>Dr CHIANG</u>

Action

<u>Lai-wan</u> accepted the nomination. As there was no other nomination, <u>Mr</u> LEUNG Yiu-chung announced that voting be conducted by secret ballot.

4. <u>Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung</u> announced that 9 members voted for Ms Claudia MO and 16 members voted for Dr CHIANG Lai-wan respectively. <u>Mr LEUNG</u> declared Dr CHIANG Lai-wan elected as the Chairman of the Subcommittee. Dr CHIANG then took the chair.

Election of Deputy Chairman

5. <u>Members</u> agreed to elect a Deputy Chairman. <u>The Chairman</u> called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Subcommittee. Ms Claudia MO was nominated by <u>Dr LAU Siu-lai</u>. The nomination was seconded by <u>Mr Jeremy TAM</u>. <u>Ms Claudia MO</u> accepted the nomination. There being no other nomination, Ms Claudia MO was elected the Deputy Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Meeting arrangements and items for discussion

- 6. <u>The Subcommittee deliberated</u> (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 7. <u>Members</u> suggested that the Subcommittee could consider discussing the following issues:
 - (a) establishment of "animal police" teams as a measure in handling and combating animal cruelty cases;
 - (b) review of the definition of cruelty to animals, and the relevant penalty under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Ordinance (Cap. 169);
 - (c) keeping dogs on construction sites, in particular, the Code of Practice for keeping of dogs on construction sites issued by the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department;
 - (d) implementation of the "Trap-Neuter-Return" trial programme;
 - (e) promotion of responsible pet ownership, including the vaccination and microchipping for cats;

Action

- (f) measures to prevent and combat illegal hunting and trapping of animals;
- (g) import and export control of animal skin and fur products;
- (h) animal-friendly measures such as arrangement for pet animals to board public transport and to enter public venues like parks and restaurants;
- (i) welfare of captive animals in Hong Kong, including those being kept in the Ocean Park; and
- (j) progress update on the implementation of the Public Health (Animal and Birds) (Animal Traders) (Amendment) Regulation 2016 after its commencement.
- 8. <u>The Deputy Chairman</u> and <u>Mr KWONG Chun-yu</u> hoped that issues referred to in paragraph 7(a) above could be discussed at the next meeting.
- 9. <u>The Chairman</u> advised that she and the Clerk would work out the meeting arrangements as appropriate, taking into account members' suggestions and in consultation with the Administration. Members would be informed of the date for holding the next meeting in due course.
