Action

The Chairman drew members' attention to Rule 83A of the Rules of Procedure ("RoP") concerning the requirement of disclosing personal pecuniary interest and RoP 84 concerning a member's voting or withdrawal in case of direct pecuniary interest.

- I. Confirmation of the terms of reference of the Select Committee (LC Paper No. CB(2)904/16-17(01))
- 2. <u>Members</u> confirmed the terms of reference ("TOR") of the Select Committee to Inquire into Matters about the Agreement between Mr LEUNG Chun-ying and the Australian firm UGL Limited ("the Select Committee"), as set out in paragraph 4 of the paper.
- **II.** Proposed practice and procedure of the Select Committee (LC Paper No. CB(2)904/16-17(02))
- 3. <u>Members</u> endorsed the proposed practice and procedure of the Select Committee, as set out in the Appendix to the paper.

III. Proposed major areas of study (LC Paper Nos. CB(2)904/16-17(03) and IN03/16-17)

4. <u>Members</u> requested the Secretariat to revise the proposed major areas of study of the Select Committee as set out in the Appendix to LC Paper No. CB(2)904/16-17(03) in the light of the following comments expressed by members:

- (a) whether or not an agreement signed/executed by both Mr LEUNG Chun-ying and UGL Limited ("UGL") existed in the first place;
- (b) item I(c) should be subsumed under and merged with item III(e);
- (c) item III(b) and (c) should be moved to the earlier part of the Appendix and be placed under item I; and
- (d) a footnote should be inserted to the originally numbered item III(b) to advise that the original text of the sentence quoted was in English and the text in Chinese was a translated version, and that readers should refer to the original English text as it appeared in the copy of the purported agreement between Mr LEUNG and UGL (Appendix II to IN03/16-17) for the authentic version.
- 5. <u>Dr Junius HO</u> requested putting on record his views that the proposed major areas of study prepared by the Secretariat were redundant and it would not be appropriate for the Select Committee to work in accordance with and be bound by any paper other than the endorsed TOR of the Select Committee. He strongly objected to the adoption of the proposed major areas of study by the Select Committee. As some members considered otherwise, <u>Dr HO</u> requested that a vote be taken on his proposal of not adopting the said paper, i.e. the Appendix to LC Paper No. CB(2)904/16-17(03).

(At the suggestion of Dr Priscilla LEUNG and with the agreement of members, the Chairman ordered that the meeting be suspended for five minutes to enable members to discuss the proposal of Dr Junius HO to take a vote on the matter. The meeting was suspended at 6:15 pm and resumed at 6:23 pm.)

- 6. <u>Members</u> agreed that decision on the question of whether a vote should be taken on Dr Junius HO's proposal to not adopt the proposed major areas of study be deferred to the next meeting.
- 7. Owing to time constraints, <u>members</u> agreed and <u>the Chairman</u> directed that discussion on the remaining two items, i.e. "Proposed work plan" and "Proposed indexing system for Select Committee papers" be deferred to the next meeting.
