Such conduct should be condemned;</li> <li>(b) members who had openly commented on the subject matter of that closed meeting should also be condemned;</li> <li>(c) the events that took place after the alleged disclosure culminated in the resignation of Mr Holden CHOW from the Select Committee. The Select Committee was in a way deprived of the opportunity to resolve the subject matter being discussed. The Select Committee's credibility had as a result been undermined and mutual trust had been lost amongst members of the Select Committee; and</li> <li>(d) the Select Committee should take follow up actions regarding the disclosure of the internal deliberations held at a closed meeting before moving on to other business.</li> </ul>

Dr HO's view that the President should be invited to exercise his power under RoP 92 to dissolve and reconstitute the Select Committee in circumstances other than those provided for in RoP 78(4) and 78(5).	
		Mr LAM Cheuk-ting's and Mr Alvin YEUNG's comment that the proposed dissolution and reconstitution of the Select Committee only served to unnecessarily prolong the Select Committee's inquiry.

		<ul> <li>(a) there was no provision in RoP or in the Practice and Procedure of the Select Committee which provided for the making of statutory declaration;</li> </ul>	
		(b) RoP 78(4) provided that a select committee should, as soon as it had completed consideration of the matter or bill referred to it, report to the Council and the committee would then be dissolved;	
		(c) it was provided in RoP 78(5) that at the end of a term every select committee of the Council should be dissolved; and	
		(d) RoP 78(4) and 78(5) were the only existing rules that provided for the dissolution of select committees.
