Reply:

In the new round of Standing Offer Agreement for Quality Professional Services 4 (SOA-QPS4) (Note) launched on 31 July 2017, the Office of the Government Chief Information Officer has incorporated various measures to foster the development of the local information technology (IT) industry and encourage innovation. These measures include:

- (1) setting up of Minor Groups under Service Category 2 On-going Services and Service Category 3 System Development and Implementation Services, and increasing the contract value ceiling from \$1.43 million prior to the coming into force of SOA-QPS4 to \$3 million to provide SMEs with more opportunities to participate in government projects;
- (2) adopting higher technical weighting (from the commonly adopted 30% to 40%) in assessing project proposals for Service Category 1 Pre-implementation Services and Service Category 3 System Development and Implementation Services; and

(3) including "innovation" in the assessment criteria for the project proposals in Service Category 3.

As at end March 2018, 52 projects under Service Category 3 have been awarded, 23 of which (44%) have included "innovation" as an assessment criterion. The related information on the 23 projects is at <u>Annex</u>.

Note: There are four service categories under SOA-QPS4: (1) Pre-implementation Services; (2) On-going Services; (3) System Development and Implementation Services; and (4) IT Security and Independent Testing Services.

- 1. Why doesn't OGCIO maintain information on the "monthly active users"? Have the departments launching the apps, the contractors developing the software or any government departments maintained the relevant statistics of the "monthly active users" of each mobile app?
- 2. The total numbers of downloads of the mobile apps could only reflect the numbers of first users, but could not accurately reflect the regular or continuous usage rate of the apps. What methods or indicators will be adopted by the Government to conduct value-for-money assessment on the regular usage rate?
- 3. Have the departments drawn up value-for-money criteria and conditions with service providers during the development of their apps? If yes, what are the details? If not, what are the justifications?
- 4. Please list out in tabular form the respective numbers of downloads of the mobile apps shown in Annex B from Google Play, Apple App Store or other App stores;
- 5. Please list out in tabular form the numbers of non-repetitive visits to/usage rate of all the mobile apps shown in <u>Annex B</u> in the last 30 days up to 31 March 2018;
- 6. Please list out in tabular form the years of rollout of all the mobile apps shown in Annex B in various App stores, and the expenditure involved for each update.

- 1, 2 According to the "Practice Guide for Developing Mobile Apps" formulated by the and Office of the Government Chief Information Officer (OGCIO), in developing
- 5. mobile apps (apps), government bureaux and departments (B/Ds) should first establish the objectives of the apps and understand the needs of target user groups. After the launch of the apps, B/Ds should also regularly review their usage and evaluate the cost-effectiveness of the apps for timely improvements. B/Ds should also conduct appropriate publicity and promotion activities to help the target users understand the objectives and the use of the apps. Having regard to the nature and design of individual apps, B/Ds will adopt suitable methods and indicators in conducting reviews (e.g. reviewing the number of notification messages issued by an app, number of cases received by an app, user ratings and reviews of an app), not limited to data on "monthly active users" or "non-repetitive visits/usage rate". OGCIO does not have B/Ds' information in this regard.
- 3. B/Ds will specify the service scope and system requirements (including security and functional requirements) when acquiring app development services. Service providers will develop the apps according to these requirements. In general, B/Ds do not draw up value-for-money criteria and conditions with service providers.
