I. Meeting with the Administration

The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Examination of sections of the Medical Council (Election and Appointment of Lay Members) Regulation

2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> completed examination of the sections of the Medical Council (Election and Appointment of Lay Members) Regulation ("the Regulation").

3. <u>The Chairman</u> requested the Administration to provide, as soon as possible, its written response to the letter dated 21 May 2018 from the Legal Adviser to the Subcommittee concerning the legal and drafting aspects of the Regulation.

Way forward and the legislative timetable

4. <u>Members</u> noted that pursuant to the decision of the Subcommittee on 17 May 2018, the Chairman would move a motion at the Council meeting of 23 May 2018 to extend the scrutiny period of the Regulation to the Council meeting of 20 June 2018. Subject to the extension of the scrutiny period of the Regulation, the deadline for giving notice of amendment to the Regulation was 12 June 2018.

[*Post-meeting note*: The resolution to extend the scrutiny period of the Regulation to the Council meeting of 20 June 2018 was passed at the Council meeting of 23 May 2018.]

- 5. The Chairman suggested that the Administration's written response referred to paragraph 3 above would be circulated to members for consideration when available. Subject to any views members might have on the Administration's written response and whether the Administration would propose any amendments to the Regulation, she would decide whether a further meeting was necessary. To allow time for the Administration to draw up the written response, the meeting scheduled for 29 May 2018 would be cancelled. Members raised no queries.
- 6. <u>Members</u> agreed that if no further meeting needed to be held, the Subcommittee would complete scrutiny of the Regulation. The Chairman would then report the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee on 8 June 2018.

Members noted that pursuant to section 1 of the Regulation, the

Permanent Secretary for Food and Health (Health) by notice published in the Gazette. The Administration advised that its plan was to, upon the expiry of the scrutiny period of the Regulation, publish, the latest, on 29 June 2018 a notice in the Gazette for appointing the day of commencement of the Regulation.
