1. Improving the water quality in Hong Kong

Raised by Mr Steven HO, Dr Priscilla LEUNG and Dr Elizabeth QUAT vide their respective letters to the Panel Chairman dated 30 March 2016, 19 and 20 October 2016 (LC Paper Nos. CB(1)735/15-16(02), LC Paper No. CB(1)24/16-17(01) and LC Paper No. CB(1)30/16-17(01)).

The Administration will brief the Panel on the latest water quality improvement in the territory, including that of Victoria Harbour, Shing Mun River and Tolo Harbour, etc., progress of the Harbour Area Treatment Scheme ("HATS") Stage 2A, the preliminary findings of the consultancy study to further enhance the coastal water quality of Victoria Harbour, and the arrangements for HATS Stage 1 maintenance.

2. Setting up the Countryside Conservation Office

As announced in the Chief Executive's 2017 Policy Address, the Government will establish a Countryside Conservation Office to co-ordinate conservation projects in remote countryside area, and has earmarked \$1 billion for the associated conservation efforts and revitalization works. The Administration will brief the Panel on the duties and scope of work of the new office, and seek the Panel's support for the creation of a permanent Assistant Director of Environmental Protection post to head the new office.

The Administration intends to submit the proposal to the Establishment Subcommittee and the Finance Committee in January and February 2018 respectively.

The Administration will seek the Panel's support on the funding application for submission to the Public Works Subcommittee/Finance Committee for the implementation of Organic Resources Recovery Centre Phase 2. The Administration will also brief the Panel on the progress of its overall food waste management plan.

As suggested by Mr CHAN Hak-kan at the meeting on 12 October 2017, the Administration was requested to explore other feasible measures to reduce food waste in order to alleviate the pressure on landfills.

11. Tightening the emission standards of non-road vehicles 1st or 2nd quarter of 2018 under the Air Pollution Control (Non-road Mobile (tentative) Machinery) (Emission) Regulation

The Administration will brief the Panel on the proposed implementation timetable of the Euro VI emission standards for non-road vehicles (except light bus) newly supplied to Hong Kong.

12. Management of indoor air quality

The item was proposed by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting of 18 October 2016. Members would like to discuss issues relating to the management of indoor air quality, including setting indoor air quality objectives, and establishing standards for hazardous emissions from household furniture.

At the meeting on 28 November 2016, Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung suggested the Panel to discuss the environmental issues relating to illegal disposal of construction and demolition materials into the sea/river. The Administration advised that these issues could be discussed under this item.

15. Review of Air Quality Objectives ("AQOs")

The Administration will brief the Panel on the findings of the AQOs review.

16. Combating Climate Change

The Administration will report the progress of its work on combating climate change.

As suggested by Mr CHU Hoi-dick at the meeting on 12 October 2017, members agreed that the item should be brought up for discussion by the Panel every year.

17. Review of the Environmental Impact Assessment To be confirmed **Ordinance (Cap. 499)**

Mr Kenneth LEUNG wrote to the Panel Chairman on 24 November 2015 (LC Paper No. CB(1)202/15-16(01) issued on 26 November 2015) proposing discussion on the captioned subject. The Administration's response was circulated vide LC Paper No. CB(1)537/15-16(01) issued on 3 February 2016.

18. Implementation of the Integrated Waste Management Facilities ("IWMF")

The Administration obtained funding approval for IWMF (waste-to-energy facilities) from the Finance Committee in January 2015 and completed the prequalification exercise in same The tender invitation for the vear. the Design-Build-Operate contract from pre-qualified the tenderers was issued in November 2016. The Public Accounts Committee ("PAC") has considered Report No. 65 of the Director of Audit, a chapter of which is on the Government's efforts in managing municipal solid waste.

PAC issued a referral memorandum dated 16 February 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)586/16-17(01)) recommending the Panel to follow up on issues relating to the captioned subject.

19. Existing policies on bicycles and promoting bicycles as a To be confirmed **mode of transport as an initiative to improve roadside air quality**

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Mr HUI Chi-fung wrote to the Panel Chairman on 23 May 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)1009/16-17 issued on 24 May 2017) proposing to hold a joint meeting with the Panel on Transport to discuss issues relating to the existing policies on bicycles and promoting bicycles as a mode of transport. Mr HUI further wrote to the Panel Chairman on 12 October 2017 proposing to discuss bicycle-friendly policies (LC Paper No. CB(1)86/17-18(01)).
