INTRODUCTION

The Government proposes to revise 13 fee items which relate to road traffic and do not directly affect people's livelihood. To this end,

- (a) at the meeting of the Executive Council on 29 August 2017, the Council **ADVISED** and the Chief Executive **ORDERED** that the Road Traffic Ordinance (Amendment of Schedule 9) Order 2017 at **Annex A** should be made under section 88P of the Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374) ("the Ordinance"); and
- (b) the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury has made, under section 29A of the Interpretation and General

Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1)¹, the Road Traffic (Driving Licences) (Amendment) Regulation 2017 at **Annex B** by virtue of section 8(1A) of the Ordinance, and the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2017 at **Annex C** by virtue of section 6(2) of the Ordinance.

2. The Government also proposes to remove three obsolete fee items. At the meeting of the Executive Council on 29 August 2017, the Council **ADVISED** and the Chief Executive **ORDERED** that the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulation 2017 at **Annex D** should be made under section 5(3) of the Ordinance.

- 3. In line with the "user pays" principle, it is Government's policy that fees charged by the Government should in general be set at levels adequate to recover the full cost of providing the relevant services.
- 4. In the 2013-14 Budget Speech, the Financial Secretary indicated that we needed a systematic review of government fees and charges and should first deal with fees which had not been revised for years and did not directly affect people's livelihood. Thereafter, departments should review the fee levels annually, and revise the fees where necessary.
- 5. In order to achieve full-cost recovery gradually and to avoid a steep fee increase, the Government has adopted the following guidelines for the fee revision:
 - (i) for those fees with existing cost recovery rate of less than 40% of target, adopt an increase of 20% or more;

Section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) stipulates that where the amount of any fee or charge is for the time being specified in subsidiary legislation made by the Chief Executive in Council, the Financial Secretary (which means also the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury by virtue of section 3 of Cap. 1) may by similar subsidiary legislation increase or

decrease, or otherwise vary, the amount of fee or charge.

- (ii) for those fees with existing cost recovery rate of 40% to 70% of target, adopt an increase of 15%;
- (iii) for those fees with existing cost recovery rate of over 70% of target, adopt an increase of 10% or less; and
- (iv) for those fees which are recovering more than the full cost, adjust downwards in order to achieve full-cost recovery.
- 6. Based on the outcome of a costing review and in the light of the above guidelines, we propose to revise 13 fee items relating to road traffic. Details of the fee revision proposals are set out at **Annex E**. Most proposed fee increases range from a few dollars to several dozen dollars² only.

7. Separately, Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations (Cap. 374 sub. leg. E) currently has a reference to three obsolete fee items, namely the fees for international fiscal permit, international certificate, and certificate of maximum load and maximum permissible weight. An international fiscal permit was issued in accordance with the 1931 International Convention³ while the latter two certificates in accordance with the 1926 International Convention⁴. As the two Conventions were no longer applicable to

Except for two fees concerning the designation of driving school and issue of a movement permit. The actual amounts of the fee payable by driving schools for the designation of driving school, or the renewal of the designation; and for a movement permit which is issued to special vehicles (such as construction site vehicles) are relatively large (\$18,150 and \$670 respectively), the respective increases therefore in dollar terms are \$1,800 and \$150.

According to the 1931 International Convention concerning tax levied on foreign vehicles, a motor vehicle of a contracting state shall be exempted from taxes or charges on its circulation in other contracting states up to a maximum of 90 days. The driver of the motor vehicle should hold an international fiscal permit issued by the place where the vehicle was registered in order to be eligible for tax exemption.

⁴ According to the 1926 International Convention concerning vehicle international circulation, the Hong Kong Government may issue an international driving permit to a holder of Hong Kong driving licence for the holder to drive in the territories of the contracting states. Pursuant to the Convention, a vehicle must be issued with an international certificate before it can circulate in the territories of contracting states and the owner of the vehicle must be in possession of a certificate of maximum load and maximum permissible weight when applying for an international certificate.

Hong Kong⁵, these permits and certificates were removed by the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulation 2007. However, the relevant fee items listed in Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations were not removed then. We therefore propose to make a technical amendment to remove the reference to these three fee items in Schedule 2. Details of the fee items are set out at **Annex F**.

8. The Transport Department and the Hong Kong Police Force will continue to enhance working efficiency and streamline their procedures, including regular review of work procedures and employing new technology to control the costs of the relevant government fees.

THE ORDER AND AMENDMENT REGULATIONS

- 9. The Road Traffic Ordinance (Amendment of Schedule 9) Order 2017, the Road Traffic (Driving Licences) (Amendment) Regulation 2017 and the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2017 increase the fees as set out in **Annex E**.
- 10. The Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulation 2017 deletes reference to three obsolete fee items, namely the fees for international fiscal permit, international certificate, and certificate of maximum load and maximum permissible weight as prescribed in Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations.

As the United Kingdom announced its withdrawal from the 1931 Convention in 1963, the Convention has ceased to apply to Hong Kong since 1964. As regards the 1926 International Convention, it was replaced by the 1949 International Convention which has abolished the international certificate and related requirements. China and the United Kingdom agreed before 1997 that the 1949 International Convention shall continue to apply to Hong Kong from 1 July 1997.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSAL

- 12. The proposal is in conformity with the Basic Law, including the provisions concerning human rights. It does not affect the current binding effect of the Ordinance and its subsidiary legislation. It has no civil service, environmental, sustainability, productivity, competition, family or gender implications.
- 13. With the proposed revision of 13 fee items, the estimated increase in revenue is about \$1.09 million per annum. The proposed increase is expected to have minimal economic implications. Most fee increases range from a few dollars to several dozen dollars only and the impact on users should be insignificant⁶.
- 14. The proposed removal of three obsolete fee items is a technical amendment and will not have any financial or economic implications.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

15. We consulted the Legislative Council Panel on Transport on 19 May 2017. Members supported the proposal, and there was a suggestion to further increase the advertising vehicle permit fee under the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) (No.

For the fee payable for the designation of driving school, or the renewal of the designation, the additional cost of \$1,800 is minimal compared to the total operating cost of a designated driving school. As for the fee for a movement permit, since the movement permit is issued only to unlicensed vehicles which are normally not authorized to be used on a road, the estimated annual caseload is only about 500. The proposed increase of the permit fee would have no impact on the majority of drivers with licenced vehicles. Even for unlicensed vehicles, the Transport Department advises that frequent application for a movement permit is not warranted. Therefore, the impact of the proposed increase of \$150 should be minimal.

2) Regulation 2017 so as to achieve an improved cost recovery rate and to avoid a steep increase in future. We have taken into account the suggestion in amending the said Regulation⁷.

Our original proposal is to increase the advertising vehicle permit fee from \$110 to \$155 (cost recovery rate increased from the existing 12.6% to 17.8%). Taking into account the Member's suggestion, we have revised our proposal to increase the fee to \$200 (with the cost recovery rate increased to 23.0%).
