Action

I. Election of Chairman

<u>Dr Priscilla LEUNG</u>, the member who had the highest precedence among members of the Bills Committee present at the meeting, presided over the election of the Chairman of the Bills Committee.

2. <u>Dr Priscilla LEUNG</u> invited nominations for the chairmanship of the Bills Committee. <u>Dr Junius HO</u> nominated Dr Priscilla LEUNG, and the nomination was seconded by Mr Holden CHOW. <u>Dr Priscilla LEUNG</u> accepted the nomination.

- 3. As Dr Priscilla LEUNG was nominated for the office, <u>Dr Junius HO</u>, the member present who had the highest precedence among the members not nominated for the office, presided over the election of chairman. There being no other nomination, <u>Dr Junius HO</u> declared Dr Priscilla LEUNG elected as the Chairman of the Bills Committee. <u>Dr Priscilla LEUNG</u> then took the chair.
- 4. Members agreed that there was no need to elect a deputy chairman.

5. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that she had been teaching at the School of Law of the City University of Hong Kong for more than 25 years.

Discussion

6. <u>The Administration</u> and <u>the Judiciary Administration</u> ("JA") briefed members on the Judicial Officers (Extension of Retirement Age) (Amendment) Bill 2019 ("the Bill"). <u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings in **Appendix**).

<u>Clause-by-clause examination of the Judicial Officers (Extension of Retirement Age) (Amendment) Bill 2019</u>

7. <u>The Bills Committee</u> commenced clause-by-clause examination of the Bill. <u>The Bills Committee</u> examined up to clause 6 of the Bill before the end of the meeting.

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration/Judiciary Administration

- 8. <u>The Administration/JA</u> was requested to provide the following information:
 - (a) a detailed breakdown of the establishment and strength of Judges as well as other Judicial Officers at various levels of courts;

- (b) a detailed breakdown of the numbers of Judges and Judicial Officers ("JJOs") who retired upon reaching the statutory retirement ages and who were approved to extend their services beyond the statutory retirement ages ("extended terms of office") over the past five years;
- (c) the Administration/JA's response to the suggestion of introducing a mechanism to review whether JJOs on extended terms of office were suitable to continue their service on a regular basis, to be conducted by JJOs concerned and JA together; and
- (d) the Administration/JA's response to the suggestion of formulating measures to relieve the administrative work of JJOs who were on extended terms of office so that they could focus on the judicial duties.

(*Post-meeting note*: JA's response was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(4)776/18-19(02) on 18 April 2019.)

Invitation of views

9. <u>The Chairman</u> suggested and <u>members</u> agreed that invitations be issued to 18 District Councils and a notice be posted on the Legislative Council ("LegCo") website for written submissions on the Bill.

(*Post-meeting note*: On 3 April 2019, invitations were sent to 18 District Councils for written submissions on the Bill. A notice was also posted on the LegCo website on the same day. A total of two written submissions were received by the Bills Committee by the submission deadline on 18 April 2019.)
