Dear Ms LAU,

Thank you for your email dated 21 December 2018. In the email, you attached a letter dated 20 December 2018 from the Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki requesting the Government to provide supplementary information on the facilities of the proposed community health centre (CHC).

2. After consolidation of information gathered from relevant bureau and departments, we provide a reply to the related issues as follows -

### Facilities of the proposed CHC

3. The proposed CHC at Tuen Mun Area 29 West is designed based on the primary care development strategy and service model. The services to be provided by the Hospital Authority include medical consultation, multi-disciplinary healthcare services, chronic disease management and patient education and support services, so as to provide a comprehensive, co-ordinated and person-centred primary care services for the citizens.

4. In order to provide the above services, the Centre will be equipped with consultation rooms with generic facilities for use by doctors and therapists. At this

stage, 23 rooms are planned for use by doctors for general consultation purpose, and another 17 rooms are planned for use by the multi-disciplinary team, e.g., physiotherapy, occupational therapy, dietetic counselling. Besides, the CHC will also be equipped with rooms for patient examination by medical staff, group therapy activities, exercise class, etc., as well as a patient resource centre (PRC), which will work with the PRCs in hospitals in supporting patients and their families/carers. As for the pharmacy, due to the huge service volume of the CHC, with a certain amount of patients with chronic diseases requiring regular follow-up at the CHC, therefore enough spaces should be provided at the pharmacy for storage of drugs, dispensary and drug counselling for patients. The CHC will also be equipped with some ancillary facilities to support the service operation, such as the area for temporary storage of clinical waste, store room of medical records and telecommunication room, etc.
