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Paper for the House Committee meeting on 2 November 2018

Report of the Subcommittee on Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Ordinance (Commencement) Notice

Purpose

This paper reports on the deliberations of the Subcommittee on Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Ordinance (Commencement) Notice ("the Subcommittee").

Background

2. The Hong Kong Section ("HKS") of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link ("XRL") is a 26 kilometres long underground rail corridor running from West Kowloon in Hong Kong to Shenzhen, where it connects to the Mainland Section of XRL. It provides high-speed rail service between the Hong Kong West Kowloon Station ("WKS") and 44 Mainland destinations. The HKS of the XRL has formally commenced operation on 23 September 2018.

Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Ordinance

- 3. The Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Bill ("the Bill") was passed by the Legislative Council ("LegCo") on 14 June 2018, and was published in the Gazette as the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Ordinance (Cap. 632) ("the Ordinance") on 22 June 2018. The Ordinance implements the co-location arrangement at the WKS which comprises the establishment of the Mainland Port Area ("MPA"), and passengers can complete clearance procedures of both Hong Kong and the Mainland at the WKS successively.
- 4. Under section 1(2) of the Ordinance, it is provided that the Ordinance comes into operation on a day to be appointed by the Secretary for Transport and Housing ("STH") by notice published in the Gazette.

The Commencement Notice

5. The Administration has advised in a paper provided to the Panel on Transport ("Panel") of LegCo in August 2018 that upon detailed discussions with the Mainland, STH decided to appoint 4 September 2018 as the day on which the Ordinance comes into operation to dovetail with the commencement of operation of the HKS of the XRL on 23 September 2018. The Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Ordinance (Commencement) Notice ("Commencement Notice") was published in the Gazette on 31 August 2018 and tabled before LegCo on 10 October 2018 in accordance with the statutory procedures.

The Subcommittee

6. At the House Committee meeting held on 5 October 2018, Members agreed to form a subcommittee to study the Commencement Notice. Under the Chairmanship of Hon Mrs Regina IP LAU Suk-yee, the Subcommittee has held one meeting with the Administration to examine the Commencement Notice. The membership list of the Subcommittee is in **Appendix I**.

Deliberations of the Subcommittee

<u>Implementation of the Ordinance in advance of the commencement of operation of the HKS of the XRL</u>

- 7. Pointing out that the Ordinance came into operation on 4 September 2018, i.e. 19 days earlier than the commencement of operation of the HKS of the XRL on 23 September 2018, Hon CHAN Chi-chuen has enquired whether the 19-day period was requested by the Mainland authorities. He is also concerned about the nature of the "requisite materials", as mentioned in the Administration's paper (LC Paper No. CB(4)90/18-19(02)), that have to be delivered to the MPA only after the Ordinance comes into operation.
- 8. The Administration advises that personnel of both the Mainland and Hong Kong authorities needs time to familiarize themselves with the relevant operational procedures prior to the commissioning of the HKS of the XRL with a view to ensuring a smooth operation of the MPA. The Administration adds that the final preparatory work conducted by the Mainland personnel includes the testing of clearance facilities at the MPA.

- 9. Hon James TO and Hon AU Nok-hin are dissatisfied that the Commencement Notice has already taken effect before LegCo has the opportunity to apply the negative vetting procedure in relation to the Commencement Notice, which brought the Ordinance into operation. Hon James TO further remarks that normally, the Administration will brief LegCo Members on the preparedness of all relevant parties and stakeholders concerned before bringing a piece of legislation into operation.
- 10. The Administration has explained that it fully respects the rights of LegCo to exercise its power and function in scrutinizing legislation. The Administration has indeed informed the Bills Committee on Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Co-location) Bill ("the Bills Committee") during the course of scrutiny that the HKS of the XRL would be commissioned in September 2018, therefore the Ordinance has to come into operation before the scheduled commissioning date of the HKS of the XRL (i.e. during summer recess of LegCo). The Administration has further pointed out that section 1(2) of the Ordinance clearly provides that the Ordinance comes into operation on a day to be appointed by STH by notice published in the Gazette. Furthermore, prior to the gazettal of the Commencement Notice on 31 August 2018, the Administration issued on 30 August 2018 an information paper titled "Right to Use and Commissioning Arrangements of the West Kowloon Station Mainland Port Area" (LC Paper No. CB(4)1518/17-18(01)) to the Panel setting out relevant arrangements, which was provided for Members' information at the Panel meeting held on 31 August 2018.

Impact of the decision of the Court in the judicial review proceedings ("JR proceedings") on the co-location arrangement and the Commencement Notice

- 11. Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon CHAN Chi-chuen are concerned about the legal consequences that might arise in respect of the implementation of the co-location arrangement under the Ordinance and the Commencement Notice and how the operation of the MPA would be affected in case the co-location arrangement is successfully challenged in subsequent JR proceedings.
- 12. The Administration has responded that the HKSAR Government is confident that the co-location arrangement is in compliance with the Constitution of the People's Republic of China ("PRC") and the Basic Law. Since the JR proceedings are ongoing, the Administration explains that it is not appropriate to comment any further at this stage.

Other issues of concern regarding the operations at the WKS after the commencement of the operation of XRL

Administration and operation of the MPA

- 13. A number of members including Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki, Hon Tanya CHAN, Hon Jeremy TAM and Hon CHAN Chi-chuen are concerned about the administration and operation of the MPA, including the number of Mainland personnel stationed in the MPA, duties that they carry out in the MPA, whether they will stay overnight in the MPA and the respective departments that they belong to.
- 14. The Administration advises that it is important to station sufficient staff at the MPA with a view to ensuring a smooth and safe operation thereat. The design of the MPA can accommodate up to 600 personnel at any time to carry out duties there. As the implementation of customs, immigration and quarantine matters in the MPA is under the Mainland's jurisdiction, it is not necessary for the Mainland to inform the HKSAR of the relevant operational arrangements therein, including the number of Mainland personnel stationed at the MPA.
- 15. The Administration further explains that in accordance with Article 6 of the "Co-operation Arrangement between the Mainland and the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region on the Establishment of the Port at the West Kowloon Station of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link Implementing Co-location Arrangement", only immigration inspection authority, customs authority, inspection and quarantine authority, integrated administration authority and railway police authority of the Mainland would station their personnel to perform duties and functions in the MPA in accordance with the laws of the Mainland ("Mainland Authorities Stationed at the MPA"). They have no enforcement powers outside the MPA, and they are required to remain inside the The Administration also stresses that while the Mainland MPA at all times. Authorities Stationed at the MPA do not stay overnight at the MPA after completion of their duties, certain officers in particular those from immigration inspection and customs authorities are required to work overnight at the MPA to conduct relevant clearance procedures for the staff of MTR Corporation Limited ("MTRCL") and its contractors, who may have to carry out maintenance and cleansing work at the MPA at night time.
- 16. Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon CHU Hoi-dick have expressed concern that there is no mechanism for the Hong Kong side to cross-check the daily number of inbound and outbound passengers passing through the MPA with the relevant Mainland authorities. The Administration explains that the situation at the WKS is no different from other land boundary control points. As per a member's request, the Administration has provided to the Subcommittee in writing the daily number of inbound and outbound passengers with a breakdown of such information by Hong Kong residents and non-Hong Kong residents since the HKS of the XRL commenced operation on 23 September 2018 up to 25 October 2018 (**Appendix II**).

Baggage size limit and ticket purchase arrangements

- 17. Some members including Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG, Hon Jeffrey LAM and Hon YIU Si-wing are concerned about the baggage size limit imposed by MTRCL. Members pointed out that some southbound passengers were permitted to carry oversized baggage to board XRL trains bound for Hong Kong, and they urged for less stringent enforcement of the baggage size limit by MTRCL so as to attract more people, especially the elderly, to use XRL trains. The Administration advises that while there are restrictions on baggage size and maximum weight of baggage, there is no limit on the number of pieces of baggage that the passengers can carry with them. The Administration takes note of members' concern and will follow up this matter with MTRCL and China Railway Corporation ("CR") to cater for the passengers' needs.
- 18. A number of members including Hon Tony TSE, Ir Dr Hon LO Wai-kwok and Hon YIU Si-wing have expressed concern about the ticket purchase arrangements. Hon YIU suggests offering fare concession to passengers during non-peak hours with a view to increasing the patronage of the XRL.
- 19. In response to members' view that the current ticket collection procedures adopted at the WKS are too complicated and that e-ticket should be introduced, the Administration advises that it has been discussing relevant matters with MTRCL and CR on various fronts, such as enhancing the ticketing arrangements and offering of concession fare to passengers during non-peak hours, with a view to improving the passengers' experiences in using the XRL. Besides, the Administration advises that it will discuss with CR on the integration of Hong Kong and the Mainland ticketing websites as well as the introduction of e-tickets as well.

Others

- 20. In response to Hon James TO's enquiry on cases where passengers at the MPA sought emergency medical assistance, the Administration has also provided information in writing in respect of (i) the number of case(s) involved and (ii) the name of hospital to which the passenger(s) concerned was/were delivered for treatment (**Appendix II**).
- 21. Mr Jeremy TAM has sought information on the remedial actions taken to tackle the water seepage problem at the WKS arising from Super Typhoon Mangkhut. The Administration's reply is in **Appendix II**.
- 22. In conclusion, the Chairman advises that members can further follow-up on the above issues relating to the operation of the XRL with the corresponding Panels/Subcommittees if necessary.

Recommendation

23. The Subcommittee did not raise any objection to the Commencement Notice and will not propose any amendment to it.

Advice sought

24. Members are invited to note the deliberations of the Subcommittee.

Government response

The Administration was requested to provide up to 25 October 2018:

(a) Daily no. of inbound and outbound passengers with a breakdown of such information by Hong Kong residents and non-Hong Kong residents since the Hong Kong Section of Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link commenced operation on 23 September 2018

Based on the information from the Immigration Department, the passenger traffic at the control point at the West Kowloon Station ("WKS") of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link ("XRL") from 23 September to 25 October 2018 is tabulated at <u>Annex I</u>.

(b) Information in respect of cases where passengers at the West Kowloon Station Mainland Port Area felt unwell and were delivered to hospitals in Hong Kong, including (i) the number of passengers involved and (ii) the name of hospital which the passenger concerned was delivered to for treatment

Based on the information from the Security Bureau, since the commissioning of the Hong Kong Section of the XRL, there was one case related to passenger in the WKS Mainland Port Area being conveyed to hospital by ambulance. There was only one passenger involved, whom was conveyed to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for treatment.

(c) Remedial actions taken and relevant photos (if any) to tackle the water seepage problem at the West Kowloon Station arising from Super Typhoon Mangkhut

During the strike of Super Typhoon Mangkhut on Hong Kong on 16 September 2018, the MTR Corporation Limited ("MTRCL") stationed staff at the WKS throughout the period. The WKS was in general in normal conditions during the typhoon, with only minor dripping at isolated locations from the station ceiling and the pedestrian subway connecting the MTR Austin Station (relevant photos at <u>Annex II</u>). Rectification works were carried out by the staff immediately.


Similar to the routine maintenance arrangements of other railway stations, MTRCL staff inspect the WKS on a regular basis and perform maintenance when necessary as early as possible to ensure that the station remains in good conditions.


