Paper for the House Committee meeting on 1 March 2019

Proposed joint-Panel duty visit to the major cities in the Yangtze River Delta Region from 21 to 24 April 2019 by the Panel on Economic Development, Panel on Commerce and Industry, Panel on Financial Affairs, and Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting

Purpose

This paper seeks the permission of the House Committee for the Panel on Economic Development, Panel on Commerce and Industry, Panel on Financial Affairs, and Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting ("the four Panels") to conduct a joint-Panel duty visit to the major cities in the Yangtze River Delta ("YRD") Region¹ to better understand their economic and financial development and study the issues concerned by members.

Background

- 2. The YRD Region was one of the first regions in the Mainland to develop and open-up, and is now known for its competitive and innovative industries. Cities and provinces in the Region have their own strengths in specific areas. For example, Shanghai is a logistics and financial centre, while Zhejiang and Jiangsu provinces have strong manufacturing bases.
- 3. In 2018, the Yangtze River Delta Regional Cooperation Office issued a three-year action plan (2018-2020) for the Region's integrative development. The three-year action plan aims to integrate the economies of Zhejiang, Jiangsu and Anhui provinces, and Shanghai, through coordination and collaborative development. The action plan sets a timetable and road map

¹ YRD metropolitan region refers to 16 cities in Shanghai, southern Jiangsu and the eastern and northern part of Zhejiang. The cities included are Shanghai, Nanjing, Suzhou, Wuxi, Changzhou, Yangzhou, Zhenjiang, Nantong, Taizhou, Hangzhou, Ningbo, Huzhou, Jiaxing, Shaoxing, Zhoushan and Taizhou.

for YRD's integrated development in the coming years and covers cooperation in 12 economic sectors including transportation energy, scientific innovation, industry, informatization, environmental protection and public services. It also focuses on seven key aspects for integrated development in the Region including transportation connectivity, industrial innovation, and collaborative and orderly opening-up of the market.

Proposed joint-Panel duty visit

- 4. In view of the strategic significance of the development of the YRD Region, the Chairmen of the four Panels consulted members in January 2019 on whether a joint-Panel duty visit to the major cities in the Region should be conducted. Based on the views and suggestions expressed by the four Panel members, the Constitutional and Mainland Affairs Bureau ("CMAB") was requested to draw up a tentative programme for members' consideration.
- 5. A joint meeting of the four Panels was held on 22 February 2019 to discuss the tentative visit programme proposed by CMAB (**Appendix I**). Members agreed that the four Panels would visit Shanghai and Hangzhou in the YRD Region from 21 to 24 April 2019 (Sunday to Wednesday). Members also put forward further views on the visit programme. The Secretariat is liaising with CMAB to fine-tune the programme in Appendix I upon further liaison with the Mainland authorities/organizations.

Participants of the visit

- 6. At the joint meeting of the four Panels on 22 February 2019, members agreed that the visit should be open to all Legislative Council ("LegCo") Members for participation, and that the President of LegCo would be invited to be the delegation leader of the visit. Members also agreed that the Chairmen of the four Panels would be the deputy delegation leaders of the visit.
- 7. To exchange views and facilitate future follow-up, members agreed that relevant Government officials, including the Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs, the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury, the Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development as well as the Secretary for Innovation and Technology would be invited to join the visit.
- 8. As at 27 February 2019, a total of 22 Members have indicated interest in joining the visit. A list of participants is in **Appendix II.**

Funding arrangements

- 9. As approved by The Legislative Council Commission, each Member is provided with an overseas duty visit ("ODV") account of \$55,000 for the purpose of duty visits outside Hong Kong organized by committees of the Council. The fund in the account is for use by the Member in a four-year term. Any expenditure in excess of the approved allocation has to be paid initially by the Member personally. However, if there are unused balances in other Members' ODV accounts at the end of the term, the funds available will be used to reimburse those Members who have expended more than their allocation, in proportion to their excess qualifying expenditure.
- 10. An initial estimate of the expenditure for the visit (including transportation, hotel accommodation, meals, miscellaneous expenses, etc.) is about \$14,775 per person which will be charged to each participating Member's ODV account. A breakdown of the estimated expenditure is in **Appendix III**. The actual expenditure is subject to the final number of participants, the visit programme, transportation cost and hotel room rate at the time of confirmation. The Secretariat will bear the cost of accompanying staff for the visit.
- 11. The expenses incurred by the Government officials participating in the visit will be borne by the Administration.

Advice sought

- 12. Rule 22(v) of the House Rules provides that should any Panel consider it necessary to undertake any activities outside Hong Kong under the name of the Panel of the Council, the prior permission of the House Committee shall be sought.
- 13. The House Committee's permission is sought for the four Panels to conduct the joint-Panel duty visit as proposed in the foregoing paragraphs.

Hangzhou RMB1,950

Exchange rate as at late February 2019: RMB1 = HK\$1.18

- 3. As the in-town transportation in the Mainland will be arranged by the Secretariat or the Administration, the subsistence allowance payable is reduced by 5% (i.e. 35% of the subsistence allowance) for the first three days. For the departure day, reimbursement of actual expenses can be claimed for meals and sundries, which is budgeted at 15% of the subsistence allowance. The subsistence allowances payable to each participating Member per day in Shanghai are HK\$1,105 (Day 1 and Day 2) and in Hangzhou are HK\$805 (Day 3) and HK\$345 (Day 4).
- 4. The actual expenditure is subject to the final number of participants, the visit programme, transportation cost and hotel room rate at the time of confirmation.
