I. Meeting with the Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre and the Administration

Declaration of interest

<u>The Chairman</u> declared that she was an arbitrator and had handled arbitration work.

Discussion

- 2. <u>Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre ("HKIAC")</u> briefed members on the Arbitration (Appointment of Arbitrators and Mediators and Decision on Number of Arbitrators) (Amendment) Rules 2019 (L.N. 76 of 2019) ("the Amendment Rules").
- 3. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings in **Annex**).
- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> concluded that the Subcommittee had completed the scrutiny of the provisions of the Amendment Rules. <u>The Subcommittee</u> did not propose any amendment to the Amendment Rules.

Invitation for written submissions

5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the deadline for the public to submit written submissions to the Amendment Rules was 8 June 2019. Written submissions received by the Subcommittee, if any, would be circulated to members for reference and HKIAC for response.

(*Post-meeting note:* With the concurrence of the Chairman, the Hong Kong Institute of Architects ("HKIA") and the Hong Kong Bar Association were allowed to submit their written submissions by 18 June 2019. HKIA's submission and HKIAC's response were circulated to members via LC Paper No. CB(4)1015/18-19(01) on 19 June 2019 and LC Paper No. CB(4)1034/18-19(01) on 20 June 2019 respectively, while the Hong Kong Bar Association indicated that it had no objection to the Amendment Rules.)

Legislative timetable

6. The Subcommittee noted that the Chairman would move a motion at the Council meeting of 5 June 2019 to extend the scrutiny period of the Amendment Rules to the Council meeting of 10 July 2019. Upon extension of the scrutiny period, the deadline for giving notice of motion to amend the Amendment Rules would be 3 July 2019. The Chairman would report the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee at the meeting on 28 June 2019.

(*Post-meeting note*: At the Council meeting of 5 June 2019, the motion to extend the scrutiny period of the Amendment Rules to the Council meeting of 10 July 2019 was passed.)
