Biennial Review of Criminal Legal Aid Fees, Prosecution Fees and Duty Lawyer Fees

INTRODUCTION

This paper briefs members on the outcome of the 2018 biennial review of criminal legal aid fees, prosecution fees and duty lawyer fees (collectively referred to as "the Fees").

PROPOSAL

2. We propose to adjust the Fees upwards by 4.0% to reflect the accumulated change in the Consumer Price Index (C) (CPI(C)) recorded between July 2016 and July 2018. The increase in criminal legal aid fees will be implemented by amending Rule 21 and Part 2 of the Schedule to the Legal Aid in Criminal Cases Rules (Cap. 221 sub. leg. D) (LACCR), while prosecution fees and duty lawyer fees will be adjusted administratively.

JUSTIFICATIONS

The Fees

3. The Legal Aid Department (LAD) provides legal aid for representation in committal proceedings in the Magistrates' Courts (MC), civil and criminal proceedings in the District Court (DC) or courts at levels above in accordance with the Legal Aid Ordinance (Cap. 91) and the LACCR. LAD will pay criminal legal aid fees to counsel and solicitors in private practice undertaking criminal litigation work on behalf of it. The fee levels are prescribed in the LACCR under the Criminal Procedure Ordinance (Cap. 221).

- 4. To complement the legal aid services provided by LAD, the Duty Lawyer Scheme, administered by DLS, provides legal representation to any defendant in the MC (except committal proceedings) where the interests of justice require, and without payment by the defendant in any such case if he/she does not have sufficient means to pay for it. The Scheme also provides, either with the agreement or at the request of the Government, other forms of legal assistance and advice, including assigning lawyers to advise and represent defendants facing extradition and persons who are at risk of criminal prosecution as a result of giving incriminating evidence in Coroner's inquest. Duty lawyer fees are the fees payable to duty lawyers engaged under the Duty Lawyer Scheme.
- 5. On the prosecution side, the Department of Justice (DoJ) also engages lawyers in private practice to prosecute criminal cases on fiat and draws reference to the same scale of criminal legal aid fees as that of LAD, so as to ensure that neither LAD nor DoJ would have unfair advantage in competing for the same pool of lawyers. At the MC level, the briefing out rates of MC "A" List¹ counsel make reference to criminal legal aid fees, while the rates for fiat counsel on DoJ's MC "B" List is tied to that for duty lawyer fees to maintain equality of arms.

Biennial review mechanism

- 6. Pursuant to the report by the then Secretary for the Treasury to the Legislative Council (LegCo) Finance Committee in October 1992, the Fees are subject to review on a biennial basis to take into account changes in CPI(C) during the reference period. In conducting the biennial reviews, the Government takes into account mainly general price movement during the reference period and whether there has been difficulty in engaging the services of counsel and solicitors.
- 7. In the previous biennial review of 2016, the Government proposed to increase the Fees by 4.0% in accordance with the movement in CPI(C) during the reference period from July 2014 to July 2016. We briefed this Panel on the outcome of the biennial review in December 2016 and the proposed adjustments to criminal legal aid fees were approved by LegCo in November 2017. The new Fees came into effect on 3 April 2018.

DoJ maintains two briefing-out lists for the magistracy level, i.e. the MC "A" List and MC "B" List. On the MC "B" List are counsel-on-fiat who substitute Court Prosecutors to prosecute cases which are not on the list of "Scheduled Duties", whereas counsel-on-fiat on the MC "A" List are briefed to prosecute relatively more complicated cases which would otherwise be handled by Government Counsel.

2018 biennial review

- 8. The Government has completed the 2018 biennial review. Noting that the CPI(C) for the reference period (i.e. July 2016 to July 2018) increased by 4.0%, we propose to adjust the Fees upwards by 4.0% accordingly. The impact of general price movement between July 2018 and July 2020 will be reflected in the next biennial review. The existing and proposed criminal legal aid fees and corresponding prosecution fees, rounded down to the nearest ten dollars, are listed in **Annex**.
- 9. For duty lawyer fees, as set out in another paper for this Panel for the meeting on 28 January 2019, the Government has completed a review and aims to adjust the fees upwards by 56.2% with effect from 1 April 2019. The existing and proposed duty lawyer fees (also rounded down to the nearest ten dollars), reflecting the adjustments pursuant to both this duty lawyer fees review and the current biennial review, are set out below –

10. As explained in paragraph 5 above, the briefing out rate for fiat counsel on the MC "B" List maintained by DoJ is tied to that for duty lawyers for equality of arms. In this connection, the fees for MC "B" List counsel will be adjusted according to the corresponding upward adjustments to duty lawyer fees as set out in paragraph 9 above. The existing and proposed fees (also rounded down to the nearest ten dollars) are as follows –

CONSULTATION

12. We have informed the Legal Aid Services Council, the Hong Kong Bar Association and the Law Society of Hong Kong of the outcome of the 2018 biennial review of the Fees.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

13. The proposed increase in criminal legal aid fees, prosecution fees and duty lawyer fees is estimated to incur an additional recurrent expenditure of around \$9.0 million each by LAD and DoJ and around \$2.5 million by DLS in a full year. The two departments and DLS will

include the necessary provisions in the 2019-20 draft Estimates to meet the costs of the proposed fee increases and absorb the workload in effecting the changes in the Fees with their existing manpower resources.

WAY FORWARD

14. As regards criminal legal aid fees, we will submit the proposed amendments to the LACCR to the Criminal Procedure Rules Committee² (Rules Committee) chaired by the Chief Judge of the High Court for approval. Subject to the Rules Committee's approval, we will move a resolution in LegCo to effect the legislative changes in the second quarter of 2019 and appoint the commencement date as soon as possible upon LegCo's approval. Prosecution fees and duty lawyer fees will be adjusted administratively on the same date as for the implementation of the increased criminal legal aid fees.

ADVICE SOUGHT

15. Members are invited to note the outcome of the biennial review.
