1. Strengthening the staffing of the Civil Engineering and Development Department to take forward land supply and development projects

The Administration will brief members on the staffing proposal of the Civil Engineering and Development Department for converting three supernumerary Chief Engineer (D1) posts to permanent posts to oversee the implementation of land supply and development projects.

27 November 2018

The submission of the relevant funding proposal to the Establishment Subcommittee ("ESC") and the Finance Committee ("FC") is tentatively scheduled for January and February 2019 respectively.

2. Proposed creation of directorate post in the Planning Department

The Administration will brief members on the staffing proposal to make permanent an existing time-limited Chief Town Planner (D1) post at the Town Planning Board Section of the Planning Department to continue secretariat support to the Town Planning Board and the handling of statutory planning matters including judicial review cases and relevant follow-up works.

27 November 2018

The submission of the relevant funding proposal to ESC and FC is tentatively scheduled for January and February 2019 respectively.

3. Proposed funding scheme to optimize the use of vacant government sites

The 2018-2019 Budget announced that \$1 billion would be set aside to subsidize the costs of basic works of eligible projects, and co-ordinate the efforts of government departments in providing technical advice to the user organizations to make better use of vacant government sites and vacant school premises. The Administration will brief members on the proposal to set up a funding scheme to optimize the use of vacant government sites.

27 November 2018

The submission of the relevant funding proposal to FC is tentatively scheduled for January 2019.

4. Revitalization of industrial buildings

At the Panel meeting on 12 October 2017, Hon KWONG Chun-yu requested to follow up his suggestion raised at the Panel meeting on 23 May 2017 that the Panel should discuss the use of industrial building units for arts and cultural purposes.

Q4 of 2018

The Administration will brief members on the recommendations upon completion of the review into possible measures on the revitalization of industrial buildings.

(Note: At the House Committee meeting on 6 October 2017, Members agreed to set up a subcommittee on issues relating to the policy on industrial buildings. The subcommittee had been put on the waiting list pending activation.)

Note: The Administration has advised that the Secretary for Development will brief the Panel on Development Bureau's initiatives in the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address and Policy Agenda

on 23 October 2018 which will cover the measures to revitalize industrial buildings. A separate discussion is considered not necessary.

5. Proposed Construction Industry Security of Payment Bill

An information paper prepared by the Administration on "public consultation on proposed security of payment legislation for the construction industry" (LC Paper No. CB(1)1033/15-16(01)) was circulated to members on 14 June 2016.

To be decided

The Administration plans to consult Panel members on the legislative framework of the proposed Construction Industry Security of Payment Bill.

6. Technical amendments to subsidiary legislations made under the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123)

The Administration will brief members on proposals (a) the **Building** (Minor Works) to amend Regulations to include more works items under the prevailing Minor Works Control System to facilitate the industry; and (b) introduce new provisions to the Building (Construction) Regulations and convert the existing prescriptive provisions performance-based ones to accommodate innovative building technologies and facilitate the industry.

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Dr Hon Junius HO enquired if the issues relating to the installation of solar photovoltaic systems on the rooftops of New Territories Exempted Houses, which were exempted from certain provisions of the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123), could be covered

under the discussion on the captioned item.

7. Fresh water supply in remote villages

This issue was raised by Hon Alice MAK and Hon TANG Ka-piu in December 2013. Ms MAK and Mr TANG expressed their concerns on the lack of fresh water supply in remote villages in their two joint letters to the Panel Chairman (LC Paper Nos. CB(1)605/13-14(01) and 879/13-14(01)). The Administration's written response has been circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)732/13-14(01).

To be decided

At the Panel meeting on 15 October 2015, Hon Alice MAK urged that the Administration should discuss the subject with the Panel as soon as possible.

At the Panel meetings on 18 October 2016 and 12 October 2017, Hon Alice MAK reiterated her request that the Administration should discuss the subject with the Panel as soon as possible.

In his letter to the Panel Chairman dated 28 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)50/16-17(01)), Hon Kenneth LAU suggested that matters related to the supply of fresh water, electricity and sewerage systems to remote villages be discussed by the Panel.

On 7 November 2016, Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Chairman (LC Paper No. CB(1)87/16-17(01)) to make a similar suggestion.

On 18 April 2017, a paper from the Administration (LC Paper No. CB(1)827/16-17(01)) on treated water supply for remote villages was issued to members.

8. Flooding problems in the rural areas

At the Panel meeting on 15 October 2015, Hon LEUNG Che-cheung suggested that the Administration should discuss with the Panel the

measures to prevent flooding in the rural areas, including how to deal with the problems involving private land ownership.

9. Unauthorized building works in New Territories Exempted Houses

At the Panel meeting on 15 October 2015, Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki suggested that the Administration should update the Panel on the enforcement actions that had been taken against unauthorized building works in New Territories Exempted Houses and the way forward for dealing with these unauthorized works. Dr KWOK reiterated this suggestion at the Panel meeting on 12 October 2017, and urged the Administration to provide a concrete timetable for discussion with the Panel on relevant issues within the 2017-2018 session.

10. Problems arising from sub-divisions of flat units and measures to tackle the problems

the meeting between Legislative Council Members and Yau Tsim Mong District Council members on 29 January 2015, the problems arising from sub-divisions of flat units (commonly known as "sub-divided units") and measures to tackle the problems were discussed. Yau Tsim Mong District Council members considered it important for the Administration to step up regulation of "sub-divided units" and suggested that, to enable the Buildings Department and other law enforcement authorities to effective enforcement take actions against irregularities, the Administration should draw up clear definitions in the relevant legislations (such as the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123) and the Building Management Ordinance (Cap. 344)) to differentiate "sub-divided units" from "cubicle apartments" and other accommodations.

Legislative Council Members attending the meeting agreed that the issues should be referred to the Panel on Development for consideration and follow-up. The referral memorandum has been circulated to Panel members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)704/14-15(01).

Panel members agreed at the meeting on 28 April 2015 that the subject matter be included in the Panel's "list of outstanding items for discussion", and wished to be briefed on the Administration's latest position on the issues.

11. Review of the Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines

At the Panel meeting on 15 October 2015, proposed Dr Hon Helena WONG that Administration should discuss with the Panel a review of the Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines ("HKPSG"). On 3 March and 11 April 2016, Hon Alice MAK and Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Chairman respectively urging for an early discussion on the subject (LC Paper Nos. CB(1)648/15-16(01) and CB(1)828/15-16(01)). Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT made the same suggestion 2016 (LC November Paper CB(1)87/16-17(01)).

the Panel meetings on 18 October 2016, At 12 October 2017 and 11 October 2018. Dr Hon Helena WONG, Hon LAU Kwok-fan and Hon CHAN Han-pan urged that the Administration should put forward a concrete timetable for discussing the item with the Panel as soon as possible. In particular, the Administration should accord priorities to reviewing the planning standards in relation to child care services, kindergarten places, caring services for the elderly, public open space and To be decided (Note)

parking spaces. Dr Hon Helena WONG opined that the current piecemeal approach of separately reviewing specific standards and guidelines in HKPSG as and when necessary was not adequate.

Note: The Administration has advised that HKPSG are a comprehensive and amalgamated set of standards and guidelines covering a wide and diverse range of land uses and facilities, as well as planning and land use related topics to guide reservation of sites for such purposes, cutting across various policy areas and involving vastly different considerations spanning over the purview of many bureaux and departments ("B/Ds"). According to the existing mechanism, topical reviews of specific standards and guidelines in the HKPSG are conducted by individual B/Ds as and when necessary, taking into account the concerned B/Ds' latest relevant policies and development Opportunities would also be taken requirements. upon such topical reviews to assess the need to review relevant or related standards and guidelines. as well as the planning practices for their The Administration does not implementation. consider it necessary or practicable to conduct a review of the whole HKPSG. If revision of existing standards and guidelines or formulation of new standards and guidelines is considered necessary, it could be taken forward at the request of relevant *B/Ds* in accordance with the established mechanism. According to the Administration, if Panel members have any question about specific areas of the planning standards and guidelines, the Development Bureau and the Planning Department stand ready to coordinate with the relevant B/Ds to provide specific responses as appropriate.

12. Review of the functions of the Town Planning Board and related issues

At the meeting of the Panel on 14 October 2008, Hon Cyd HO and Hon Abraham SHEK suggested that issues related to the review of the functions of the Town Planning Board, town planning procedures, and secretariat support for the Town Planning Board should be discussed.

To be decided (Note)

Panel members also requested that the Administration should provide information about the details of the basis for determining the various fee items under the Town Planning Ordinance, the estimated costs incurred by the Administration in processing various types of planning applications each year, reconsider extending the fee waiver to all applications relating "public causes", "public purposes" or "public interest" as a matter of policy, and consult Heung Yee Kuk on the fee items applicable to Small House applications.

On 24 November 2014, Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN wrote to the Chairman suggesting that matters related to amendments to the Town Planning Ordinance, functions of the Town Planning Board, the town planning procedure, etc. be discussed by the Panel as letter soon possible. The and as Administration's responses were circulated members vide LC Paper Nos. CB(1)299/14-15(01), CB(1)556/14-15(01) and CB(1)764/14-15(01).

Note: The Administration has advised that review of the Town Planning Ordinance is not a priority of the Development Bureau and it has not been factored into its current work plan.

13. Small House Policy and rural planning strategy

At the meeting of the Panel on 13 October 2011, Hon CHAN Kam-lam urged that the Administration should discuss the issues relating to the Small House Policy with the Panel. Hon Albert CHAN proposed that the discussion should also cover the Administration's rural planning strategy.

To be decided (Note)

In the Public Accounts Committee ("PAC") Report No. 61 tabled in the Council on 12 February 2014, PAC urged the Administration to expedite the review of the Small House Policy and recommended that the issue be followed up by the Panel.

On 18 October 2017, Hon Kenneth LAU wrote to the Chairman suggesting that matters relating to the formulation of a comprehensive rural policy be discussed by the Panel (LC Paper No. CB(1)210/17-18(02)).

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Tanya CHAN requested an early discussion on this item.

Note: The Administration has advised that it was unable to set a definite timetable for completing the review of the Policy due to the complexity of the issues involved.

14. Development of leisure and entertainment facilities at Sunny Bay

At the Panel meeting on 12 October 2017, Hon Michael TIEN urged the Administration to report to the Panel on the outcome of its planning and engineering study on Sunny Bay reclamation, taking into account the suggestions made in his motion passed at the Panel meeting on 28 March 2017. His motion requested that the Administration should allow flexibilities for the

development of different leisure and entertainment facilities such as multi-purpose venues for holding road events.

15. Developing land resources

At the Panel meeting on 12 October 2017, Hon Michael TIEN requested the Panel to conduct focused discussions on the following initiatives under the 2017 Policy Address: (a) increasing substantially the supply of units under the Green Form Subsidized Home Ownership Scheme; (b) exploring the reactivation of the revitalization scheme for industrial buildings to offer incentives to encourage redevelopment or wholesale conversion; and (c) formulating a policy framework on brownfield development.

To be decided (Note)

Note: The Administration has advised that for Part (a), it is under the purview of the Transport and Housing Bureau. The Hong Kong Housing Authority ("HA") launched the sale of the Green Form Subsidized Home Ownership Scheme ("GSH") pilot project King Tai Court in October 2016, and the project has been completed in mid-2017. has conducted a review on the GSH pilot project and endorsed regularizing GSH in January 2018. Transport and Housing Bureau briefed the Panel on Housing on the outcome of the review at its meeting on 5 March 2018. A separate discussion at the Panel on Development is considered not necessary. For Part (b), the Secretary for Development will brief the Panel on Development Bureau's initiatives in the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address and Policy Agenda on 23 October 2018 which will cover the measures to revitalize industrial buildings, and therefore, a separate discussion is considered not necessary either. For Part (c), brownfield sites are one of the land supply options being reviewed by the Task Force on Land Supply, and the formulation of a

policy framework on brownfield development will be considered taking into account the five-month public engagement exercise launched by the Task Force on 26 April 2018.

16. Short term tenancies

At the Panel meeting on 12 October 2017, Hon CHAN Chi-chuen requested to discuss the policy relating to the granting of short term tenancies, as well as measures to avoid abuses.

To be decided

17. Preservation of the General Post Office Building in Central

Hon HUI Chi-fung wrote to the Panel on 22 June 2018 (LC Paper No. CB(1)1187/17-18(01)) requesting the Panel to discuss the preservation of the General Post Office Building in Central.

To be decided

18. Lantau Tomorrow

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Tanya Chi-chuen. Hon **CHAN** Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki, Hon Steven HO and Hon Holden CHOW suggested a separate discussion on the planning for Lantau Tomorrow put forward in the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address and the related issues, such as impact of the proposed large-scale reclamation, the associated strategic transport plan including the feasibility of traffic link connecting Tsing Yi and Lantau. Hon CHAN Chi-chuen requested the Administration to brief members on updated technical studies on reclamation taking into account the occurrences of stronger typhoons. Given that the subject would involve issues under the purview of various policy bureaux, Hon Steven HO suggested the Panel to hold a joint meeting with other relevant Panel(s) on the subject.

19. Land Sharing Pilot Scheme

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Tanya CHAN suggested a separate discussion on the Land Sharing Pilot Scheme put forward in the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address. Given that the Scheme would have impact on the development of the local agriculture industry and involve issues under the purview of various policy bureaux, Hon Steven HO suggested the Panel to hold a joint meeting with other relevant Panel(s) to discuss the subject.

20. Tree management in Hong Kong

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon Wilson OR suggested discussion on tree management in Hong Kong, covering measures for optimizing the role and functions of the Tree Management Office, review of existing regulations and guidelines, and other tree management matters.

21. Report of the Task Force on Land Supply

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, the Chairman and Hon CHAN Chi-chuen considered that the Administration should brief the Panel on the final report and recommendations of the Task Force.

22. Energizing Kowloon East

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Wilson OR requested that the Administration should update the Panel on the latest progress made under the Energizing Kowloon East initiatives, in particular the traffic and road improvement measures to solve the traffic congestion problem in Kwun Tong.

23. Management of public works

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Dr Hon CHENG Chung-tai suggested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the contracting and tendering arrangements/mechanism of public works projects.

24. Urban renewal

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon Vincent CHENG suggested that the Administration should brief the Panel on the role of the Development Bureau in expediting urban renewal projects.

Q2 of 2019

Note: The Administration has advised that it plans to brief Panel members on the progress of the work of the Urban Renewal Authority and its work plan for the next financial year in Q2 of 2019, which will include the Government's role in urban renewal projects.

25. Glass curtain walls and windows of buildings

At the Panel meeting on 11 October 2018, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested discussion on the standards and regulations relating to the construction of glass curtain walls and windows under the Buildings Ordinance (Cap. 123) and its subsidiary legislation, with particular focus on whether the prevailing standards were adequate to ensure safety during strong typhoons.

Public Works Programme ("PWP")

1. Capital Works Reserve Fund block allocation for 2019-2020

The Administration will brief members on the Capital Works Reserve Fund block allocations for 2019-2020.

The submission of the relevant funding proposal to the Public Works Subcommittee ("PWSC") and FC is tentatively scheduled for December 2018 and January 2019 respectively.

2. PWP Item No. 6188TB — Proposed footbridge near MTR Kowloon Bay Station Exit B

The Administration will brief members on the proposal to upgrade the item to Category A for construction of the footbridge near MTR Kowloon Bay Station Exit B.

The submission of the relevant funding proposal to PWSC and FC is tentatively scheduled for January and February 2019 respectively.

3. PWP Item No. 7065TR — Final Public Consultation on the Detailed Feasibility Study for Environmentally Friendly Linkage System for Kowloon East

The Administration will brief members on the findings of the Detailed Feasibility Study for the Environmentally Friendly Linkage System ("EFLS"), and consult members on the recommended scheme and the way forward of EFLS.

4. PWP Item No. 5768CL — Strategic Studies for Artificial Islands in the Central Waters

The Administration will brief members on the proposal of upgrading the project to Category A for carrying out the strategic studies for artificial islands in the central waters.

5. PWP Item No. 5767CL — Planning and Engineering Study on Reclamation at Lung Kwu Tan

The Administration will brief members on the proposal of upgrading the project to Category A for carrying out the planning and engineering study on reclamation at Lung Kwu Tan and its adjoining areas.

6. PWP Item No. 7213CL — Engineering works for Ha Mei San Tsuen Village Expansion Area; and PWP Item No. 7394CL — Sha Tin New Town — stage 2 — servicing and extension of Pai Tau Village in Area 6A
