Revision of Non-livelihood Related Statutory Fees and Charges under the Purview of the Water Supplies Department

PURPOSE

This paper outlines the proposed revision of 25 government fees and charges for services under the purview of Water Supplies Department (WSD) which do not directly affect people's livelihood or general business activities.

THE PROPOSAL

- 2. In line with the "user pays" principle, it is the Government's policy that fees and charges should in general be set at levels adequate to recover the full cost of providing the services. The 25 items of non-livelihood related statutory fees and charges under the purview of WSD are prescribed in Parts 1 and 4 of Schedule 1 to the Waterworks Regulations (Cap. 102A) under the Waterworks Ordinance (Cap. 102). The 25 items were last revised on 1 January 2015 based on review of the costs of providing the relevant services at 2014-15 price level.
- 3. A review of the costs of providing the relevant services at 2018-19 price level has been carried out recently. The result shows the cost recovery rates at existing fee levels for the 25 items range from 19.6% to 93.7%. In order to achieve full-cost recovery gradually and to avoid a steep fee increase, we propose to adopt the following guidelines for the fees and charges revision in our proposal for the 25 items
 - (a) for items with existing cost recovery rate of less than 40%, adopt an increase of about 20% or more; in particular, for items with existing cost recovery rate well under 40%, adopt a more aggressive percentage increase to achieve full-cost recovery within 5 to 7 years;
 - (b) for items with existing cost recovery rate of between 40% and 70%, adopt an increase of about 15%; and

- (c) for items with existing cost recovery rate of over 70%, adopt an increase of about 10% or lower.
- 4. Details of the fees and charges revision proposal with upward adjustments ranging from 6.2% to 31.6% for the 25 items are provided in the **Annex.** Should the proposed fees and charges revision be implemented, the cost recovery rates would be improved, ranging from 25.8% to 99.5%.

EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT MEASURES

5. The Government will continue to enhance efficiency and streamline procedures so as to contain the costs of providing these public services.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATION

6. Should the proposed fees and charges revision be implemented, the estimated increase in revenue would be about \$2.8 million per annum.

WAY FORWARD

7. Members are invited to note the proposed fees and charges revision as set out in paragraphs 3 and 4 above and detailed in the **Annex**. We will proceed with the necessary legislative amendments to implement the adjustments.
