## **Auditor Regulatory Reform**

- Support 7 Bill's Committee meetings research and analysis papers
- Stakeholder engagement
  - 9 presentations to 46 audit firms that audit listed companies
  - 9 media interviews (84 clippings) and
    2 meetings with academic columnists
  - Provided updates to 5 professional bodies
