## Legislative Council Panel on Home Affairs Community Care Fund

## Purpose

This paper briefs Members on the work progress of the Community Care Fund ("CCF") and seeks Members' views in this regard.

## Background

2. The CCF is a trust fund established in early 2011 under the Secretary for Home Affairs Incorporation Ordinance (Cap. 1044) with the Secretary for Home Affairs Incorporated as its trustee. Its main objective is to provide assistance to people with financial difficulties, in particular those who fall outside the social safety net or those within the safety net but still have some special circumstances that are not covered. In addition, the CCF may also consider introducing programmes on a pilot basis to help the Government identify those measures that can be considered for incorporation into its regular assistance and service programmes.

3. The CCF has since 2013 been integrated into the work of the Commission on Poverty ("CoP"). The CCF Task Force, set up under the CoP as chaired by the Chief Secretary for Administration, is responsible for advising the CoP on CCF's various arrangements (including investment, finance and administrative operations, etc.), as well as formulating assistance programmes, coordinating and overseeing the implementation of assistance programmes and evaluating their effectiveness.

4. The Finance Committee ("FC") of the Legislative Council ("LegCo") approved the injection of \$5 billion into the CCF in May 2011. The FC also approved in June 2013 an additional injection of \$15 billion into the CCF to strengthen the poverty alleviation efforts.

## Work Progress

Assistance Programmes

5. Since its establishment, the CCF has launched 47 assistance programmes covering the medical, education, welfare, home affairs and housing areas for various target beneficiary groups including children, elderly persons,

persons with disabilities, patients, new arrivals and ethnic minorities, etc. Its aim is to identify those who cannot benefit from the existing social safety net and to provide them with assistance. The total commitment is over \$9.5 billion. The CCF programmes have benefitted about 1.64 million cases and the CCF has disbursed around \$6.629 billion<sup>1</sup> to implementing agencies as at the end of December 2018. The CCF also implemented measures on a pilot basis to help the Government identify those initiatives that have been proven effective for incorporation into the regular assistance programmes. The Government so far has incorporated 12 programmes under the CCF into its regular assistance programmes and plans to incorporate the Dementia Community Support Scheme into its regular assistance programmes after the end of the pilot period. Besides, eight programmes were completed. The latest progress of the programmes is set out at the **Annex**.

Since June 2018 when this Panel was briefed on the work progress of 6. the CCF, the CoP has endorsed the implementation of the Subsidy to Purchase and Construct Modular Housing as a Pilot Scheme ("the Pilot Scheme") to facilitate the Hong Kong Council of Social Service ("HKCSS") to implement their Modular Social Housing Scheme - Nam Cheong Street ("Modular Social HKCSS will purchase and construct modular housing Housing Scheme"). through assembly of synthetic building technology which must meet the safety requirements for housing under the existing law and regulations. The Modular Social Housing Scheme will last for two years (after the completion of the modular housing). The Pilot Scheme's total funding provision is \$35.74 million and is expected to benefit about 90 households. HKCSS is conducting the tender exercise for the Pilot Scheme. Moreover, the Education Bureau has been implementing a three-school-year programme of the Provision of Subsidy to Needy Primary and Secondary Students for Purchasing Mobile Computer Devices to Facilitate the Practice of E-learning ("the Programme") starting from the 2018/19 school year. Target beneficiaries are students of public sector primary and secondary schools who are receiving the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance or full or half grant under the School Textbook Assistance Their schools and classes should be implementing e-learning and Scheme. recommend the students to bring their own mobile computer device. The Programme's total funding provision is \$415.54 million. It is estimated that about 19 000 students would be benefited in the 2018/19 school year<sup>2</sup>.

7. In addition, through continuous review of existing programmes, the CCF would also identify individual programmes that need to be revised or extended in a timely manner so that the assistance being provided can be more appropriate and effective. In this regard, the CoP endorsed the extension of three assistance programmes, including:

- (a) extending the Special Care Subsidy for the Severely Disabled Programme for 24 months starting from November 2018 and revising the programme budget;
- (b) upon extending the Elderly Dental Assistance Programme for three years from March 2019 to February 2022, refining its service scope to cover elderly persons who are aged 65 or above and receiving Old Age Living Allowance. It is expected that an addition of 150 000 elders will become eligible for applying for the Elderly Dental Assistance Programme; and
- (c) extending the cut-off date for accepting new cases and receiving the first dose of vaccine under the Cervical Cancer Vaccination Pilot Scheme by six months from March 2019 to the end of September 2019 and to allow eligible applicants to complete the vaccination by receiving the second and/or third dose in the ensuing six months.

As for the CCF Medical Assistance Programmes, seven new specified 8. self-financed cancer drugs will be introduced under the coverage of the First Phase Programme of Medical Assistance Programmes including three lung cancer drugs (Ceritinib, Alectinib and Osimertinib), three breast cancer drugs (Palbociclib, Trastuzumab emtansine (T-DM1) and Everolimus) and one drug for the treatment of renal cell carcinoma (Axitinib); the medical device (Impella) for the treatment of coronary artery disease will be introduced under the coverage of the Subsidy for Eligible Patients of Hospital Authority to Purchase Specified Implantable Medical Devices for Interventional Procedures Programme; the means test mechanism for CCF medical assistance programmes will also be enhanced. Enhancement measures include modifying the calculation of the patients' annual disposable financial resources for drug subsidy applications by lowering the amount of assets to be counted; and refining the definition of "household" adopted in financial assessment. The implementation of the two enhancement measures will further protect patients' household assets, alleviate the financial and emotional burden on patients' household arising from medical expenditure as well as avoiding depletion of household assets due to the patients' medical expenses.

### **Financial Position**

9. A total of \$15 billion has been placed with the Hong Kong Monetary Authority<sup>3</sup> ("HKMA") to earn investment returns linked to the performance of the Hong Kong Exchange Fund. The remaining funds of the CCF have been placed with banks as Hong Kong dollar time deposit, so as to generate interest income and meet the cash flow requirements of the assistance programmes and other liquidity needs.

10. As at the end of December 2018, the balance of the CCF stood at around \$19.759 billion, consisting mainly of the placement of \$17.821 billion at the HKMA and bank deposits of around \$1.938 billion, total investment return being \$4.568 billion.

## Consultation and Monitoring

11. On consultation work, we plan to conduct four public consultation sessions from February to April this year on Hong Kong Island, in Kowloon, New Territories East and New Territories West to collect views on the formulation of new assistance programmes and the work of the CCF from the community and stakeholders, with a view to introducing more appropriate assistance programmes. The CCF always welcomes members of the public or stakeholders to provide ideas or suggestions through various channels, including the CCF webpage, letters, facsimiles, emails and telephone hotlines. The ideas and suggestions received will be circulated to the CCF Task Force for reference.

12. The CoP and its CCF Task Force will continue to monitor the implementation of various assistance programmes. Government departments and other organisations entrusted to implement the programmes will submit progress and financial reports regularly to the CCF Task Force for a review of the programmes. Before launching any brand-new pilot programmes with an estimated funding provision of over \$100 million, the Government will consult the relevant LegCo Panels. We will continue to report regularly on the financial position of the CCF and the implementation progress of its programmes to this Panel every six months. We will also provide this Panel with evaluation reports of the programmes. Relevant information will be uploaded to the CCF webpage for easy reference by the public.

The CoP endorsed the withdrawal of an amount of \$3 billion to meet the cash flow requirements of the CCF for the period between August 2019 and June 2023, and the extension of the placement of the remaining \$7 billion with the HKMA in July 2019, while the cumulative investment return on the original placement of \$10 billion at maturity should be withdrawn from the HKMA in phases according to cash flow needs.
