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I. Pilot Accredited Registers Scheme for Healthcare Professions [LC Paper Nos. CB(2)369/18-19(01) and (02)]

Presentation of views by deputations

Members noted the following papers on the subject under discussion:

- (a) the paper provided by the Administration (LC Paper No. CB(2)369/18-19(01)); and
- (b) the updated background brief entitled "Accredited Registers Scheme for Healthcare Professions" prepared by the Legislative Council ("LegCo") Secretariat (LC Paper No. CB(2)369/18-19(02)).
- 2. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded the organizations and individuals attending the meeting that they were not covered by the protection and immunity provided under the Legislative Council (Powers and Privileges) Ordinance (Cap. 382) when addressing the Panel. At the invitation of the Chairman, a total of 89 organizations and individuals presented their views on the Pilot Accredited Registers Scheme for Healthcare Professions ("the AR Scheme"). A summary of their views is in the **Appendix**. <u>Members</u> also noted the 131 written submissions from organizations and individuals not attending the meeting.

Discussion

The Administration's response to the views expressed by deputations

3. <u>Under Secretary for Food and Health</u> ("USFH") briefed members on the background of the AR Scheme and the latest development in this regard, details of which were set out in the Administration's paper. In response to the views and concerns expressed by many deputations regarding the accreditation of one professional body for administering the register of the

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clinical psychologist profession, <u>Deputy Secretary for Food and Health</u> (Health) 3 ("DS(H)3") stressed that the Administration and the appointed Accreditation Agent (i.e. The Jockey Club School of Public Health and Primary Care of The Chinese University of Hong Kong) had maintained close communication with the relevant professional bodies and stakeholders in the past two years. Around 20 meetings had already been held to exchange views. The Administration would take into account the stakeholders' concerns and the outcomes of the review to be conducted by the Accreditation Agent when considering how to take the matter forward.

Implementation of the AR Scheme

- 4. Mr SHIU Ka-chun expressed appreciation for the Administration's effort in maintaining communication with the stakeholders of the clinical psychologist profession on the AR Scheme. Noting that members of the clinical psychologist profession had divergent views on the educational and training requirements to be adopted as the standards for accreditation, Dr Helena WONG asked whether the Accreditation Agent would facilitate the communication between the two professional bodies concerned and other stakeholders in order to draw up an inclusive proposal.
- 5. <u>USFH</u> advised that the Accreditation Agent was requested to maintain close communication with the 15 non-statutorily regulated healthcare professions, including the clinical psychologist profession, in taking forward the AR Scheme. In response to Dr Fernando CHEUNG's question about a deputation's concern that the Hong Kong Orthoptists Association was not timely informed of the launching of the AR Scheme, <u>DS(H)3</u> said that to his understanding, all the 15 healthcare professions concerned had been invited to attend the dedicated focus group meetings and consultation forums held in 2014 and 2015.
- 6. <u>Dr Helena WONG</u>, <u>Mr SHIU Ka-chun</u> and <u>Mr CHAN Chi-chuen</u> were concerned that some deputations had cast doubt on the independence of the Accreditation Agent in assessing the accreditation applications in respect of the clinical psychologist profession. <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> held the view that the Administration should have earlier appointed an independent overseas professional organization to address the disputes over the educational and training requirements put forth in the accreditation proposals submitted by the two clinical psychologist professional bodies. <u>Dr KWOK Ka-ki</u> urged the Administration to take measures to ensure that the accredited proposal would be fair and inclusive enough to allow the registration of qualified clinical psychologists, including those who were trained overseas and/or licensed or registered with overseas statutory regulatory bodies.

- 7. <u>DS(H)3</u> stressed that the Administration attached high importance to the principles of "one profession, one professional body, one register" and "inclusiveness" in implementing the AR Scheme. If a healthcare profession having more than one professional bodies could not reach consensus on various issues on the AR Scheme, consideration should be given to setting up a new professional body for applying to become the accredited professional body. For the case of the clinical psychologist profession, the Accreditation Agent had commenced the accreditation process upon receiving the revised proposal from the professional body concerned in November 2018. It would tender its recommendations to the Department of Health ("DH") for consideration as and when appropriate.
- 8. <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> was worried that continuous disputes amongst members of the clinical psychologist profession over the AR Scheme might cause adverse impact on the manpower supply and service provision of the profession. <u>Mr SHIU Ka-chun</u> was concerned that there were controversies over some of the educational and training requirements proposed in the proposal being assessed by the Accreditation Agent. <u>Mr POON Siu-ping</u> expressed concern about the patient privacy concern arising from the said proposal. <u>The Chairman</u> urged the Administration to respond squarely to the concerns raised by some members of the profession instead of leaving them to the Accreditation Agent to address.
- 9. <u>USFH</u> and <u>DS(H)3</u> assured members that the Accreditation Agent would examine, among others, the proposed education and training requirements, and whether the proposal was in compliance with the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance (Cap. 486) and other legislation when assessing the accreditation applications. The Administration would take into account the recommendations made by the Accreditation Agent when considering the way forward.
- 10. Mr POON Siu-ping sought information on the timetable for the accreditation process of the AR Scheme. Dr Fernando CHEUNG asked about the Administration's timetable for the accreditation of the clinical psychologist profession in the absence of consensus amongst the members of the profession on the education and training requirements. Mr SHIU Ka-chun and Dr KWOK Ka-ki questioned about the Administration's stance on how to take forward the accreditation for the clinical psychologist profession. Raising a similar question, Mr CHAN Chi-chuen considered that since the AR Scheme was of voluntary nature, LegCo could only play a minor role in the matter.

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11. <u>DS(H)3</u> updated members that DH had announced the accreditation results for the speech therapist and audiologist professions in April and November 2018 respectively. The accredited professional bodies would go through a review by the Accreditation Agent at the end of the first year of accreditation on their implementation actions for recommendations to continue the full accreditation status for three years. The accreditation results for the dietitian and educational psychologist professions were expected to be announced by phases in 2019. As regards the accreditation of clinical psychologist profession, it was expected that the Accreditation Agent would tender its recommendations to DH for consideration in 2019.

Statutory regulation over the 15 healthcare professions

- 12. <u>Mr CHAN Chi-chuen</u> was concerned that those healthcare personnel not on the registers of the accredited professional bodies could continue to practise. <u>Dr Helena WONG</u> cast doubt on the effectiveness of the voluntary AR Scheme in regulating the 15 healthcare professions concerned. She asked whether the Administration had any plan to introduce statutory regulation over these professions in the long run. <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u> considered that the putting in place of a statutory regulatory regime could better safeguard public health.
- 13. <u>USFH</u> advised that given the considerable time needed for the introduction of a statutory regulatory regime and the findings of a relevant survey, the Administration decided to introduce the voluntary AR Scheme as a first step. To ensure the governance of the professional bodies and the professional competency of their registrants, the accredited professional bodies concerned had to meet a set of accreditation standards covering operational effectiveness, risk management and quality improvement, standards for registrants, educational and training requirements, and management of the register.

Manpower supply

14. Expressing concern over the current manpower shortage of clinical psychologist and educational psychologist, <u>Dr KWOK Ka-ki</u> asked whether the Administration had any plan to increase the number of the University Grants Committee ("UGC")-funded first-year-first-degree intake places per annum for the two professions. <u>DS(H)3</u> advised that as announced in the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address, the Administration planned to increase, among others, the publicly-funded taught postgraduate places in clinical psychology in the 2019-2020 to 2021-2022 UGC triennium.

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II. Any other business

- 15. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded members that the Panel would hold a special meeting on 11 December 2018 from 9:00 am to 11:30 am to receive views from members of the public on "Review findings of means test mechanism for Samaritan Fund and Community Care Fund Medical Assistance Programmes".
- 16. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 8:26 pm.
