As a clinical psychology trainee, I have directly benefited from such supervision approach and I support onsite supervision as an essential part of clinical training. It is rather challenging for a trainee who is without clinical experience to manage cases independently. Clinical supervisors are on-site clinical psychologists who are familiar with their roles and job duties. The presence of clinical supervisors does not only provide the trainees a good opportunity to observe and learn from their conceptualizations and management of cases, but also to learn from their passions, values and professional responsibilities as a clinical psychologist.
