		WKCDA indicated that:

Moreover, the Highways Department was carrying out road improvement projects in the West Kowloon Reclamation Development area for completion by 2019. Mr YICK's views would be relayed to TD for consideration of measures to further improve the traffic conditions of WKCD;

		WKCDA stressed that while autonomous vehicle service could provide an east-west connection, the development of an underground road was the key to the enhancement of connectivity of WKCD.		
		The Administration added that:		
		(a) the funding proposal on the remaining works of IB, covering the construction of an underground road in WKCD, had been submitted to the Public Works Subcommittee for endorsement; and		
		(b) TD had completed a detailed study on the traffic conditions between WKCD and its neighbouring district in 2009 and the study suggested the implementation of seven road improvement projects. Upon completion of the said projects, the road network concerned would be able to cope with the traffic flow up to 2031, thereby significantly improving the external traffic connection of WKCD.
