Proposed timing for discussion

1. Purchase of premises for the provision of welfare facilities

Item proposed by the Administration.

10 June 2019

The Administration will brief members on the initiative to allocate \$20 billion for the purchase of premises for provision of welfare facilities and seek support for the funding submission to the Finance Committee.

2. Review of measures to encourage employment under the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance Scheme

Hon SHIU Ka-chun has suggested that the Panel should discuss "Review of supplements, special grants, maximum amount of disregarded earnings and the Support for the Self-reliance Scheme under the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance Scheme".

10 June 2019

The Administration will brief members on the scope and arrangements for reviewing the measures to encourage employment under the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance ("CSSA") Scheme.

In adjusting the eligible age for elderly CSSA from the age of 60 to 65 with effect from 1 February 2019, the Administration is committed to conducting a review of measures to encourage employment under the CSSA Scheme. The Administration undertook to complete the review by the end of 2019.

3. Updating of the Standardised Care Need Assessment Mechanism for Elderly Services

Item proposed by Hon SHIU Ka-chun, Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG Chiu-hung and Hon Andrew WAN Siu-kin. They also suggested that deputations should be invited to give views on the subject matter.

4. Language support services and dedicated outreach services teams for ethnic minorities

Hon KWONG Chun-yu has suggested that the discussion of this item should cover provision of language support services for ethnic minorities to facilitate their application for social welfare and community services.

8 July 2019

Hon SHIU Ka-chun has suggested that mainstreaming of social services for ethnic minorities should also be discussed.

Hon KWONG Chun-yu and Hon SHIU Ka-chun have suggested that a joint meeting with the Panel on Home Affairs ("HA Panel") should be held to discuss and receive views of relevant deputations on the subject matter. Representatives of the Home Affairs Bureau ("HAB") should also attend the relevant meeting for discussion of this item.

The Administration established the Steering Committee on Ethnic Minorities Affairs, under the chairmanship of the Chief Secretary for Administration, in July 2018 to enhance internal collaboration among government bureaux/departments on support for ethnic minorities.

5. Emergency welfare measures and community services for handling typhoons

Item proposed by Hon KWONG Chun-yu and 8 July 2019

Hon SHIU Ka-chun.

Hon KWONG Chun-yu has suggested that the item should be discussed at a joint meeting with the HA Panel and relevant deputations should be invited to give views on the subject matter.

The Panel on Security has discussed "Review of the Government's handling of super typhoon" at its meeting on 7 May 2019.

6. Support for divorced families and recovery of maintenance payments

Item proposed by Hon KWONG Chun-yu and 8 July 2019 Hon SHIU Ka-chun.

Hon KWONG Chun-yu has suggested that a joint meeting with the HA Panel should be held to discuss this item.

7. Special Needs Trust

The Panel discussed "Special Needs Trust" at its 15 July 2019 meeting on 11 March 2019.

Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG Chiu-hung has suggested that the Panel should receive public views on the subject matter.

Services for elderly

8. Care services for elderly persons with special needs

The Subcommittee on Issues Relating to the Future Development of Elderly Services Schemes formed under the Panel of the Fifth Legislative Council ("the former Panel") had studied, inter alia, care services for elderly persons with special needs. In its report (LC Paper No. CB(2)1902/15-16) the Subcommittee suggested that the Panel should

follow up the provision of services by the Administration for elderly persons with chronic diseases, dementia or disabilities as well as elderly persons from ethnic minorities and from sexual minorities.

Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki has suggested that welfare for elderly persons living alone should also be discussed.

9. Infirmary care in non-hospital setting

The Administration consulted the Panel of the Third Legislative Council ("LegCo") in December 2004 on a proposal to launch a trial scheme to provide infirmary care places for medically stable elders in a non-hospital setting. Various options are being explored, including upgrading some of the places in subvented residential care homes for the elderly to provide infirmary care. The Administration will report the progress in due course.

10. Second Phase of the Pilot Scheme on Community Care Service Voucher for the

13. Provision of social workers in schools

The Panel has discussed and received public views on "Pilot Scheme on Social Work Service for Pre-primary Institutions" at its special meeting on 22 June 2018. Hon KWONG Chun-yu and Hon SHIU Ka-chun have suggested that the Panel should discuss the provision of social workers in kindergartens.

As it is announced in the 2019-2020 Budget that funding will be allocated for increasing the number of school social workers to two per secondary school, Hon KWONG Chun-yu has proposed that the Panel should also discuss the provision of additional social workers for secondary schools. He has suggested that a joint meeting with the Panel on Education ("ED Panel") should be held to discuss the item and representatives of the Education Bureau ("EDB") should also attend the relevant meeting.

14. Child protection policy and a proposed Member's bill on such policy

Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG Chiu-hung has requested the Panel to discuss child protection policy and his proposed Member's bill on such policy, which will soon be presented to the Panel for consideration.

15. Welfare measures for facilitating children and youth development

The former Panel agreed to explore whether to discuss the issue "Exploring a way out for young people in respect of welfare, education and employment, etc. under deep-rooted social conflicts in light of the Mongkok Riot occurred on 8 February 2016".

Hon SHIU Ka-chun has suggested discussing as soon as possible the captioned subject matter which also covers the issue mentioned above.

16. Mental health of children and adolescents and related community support services

Given that mental health of children and adolescents is a key area of discussion of the Advisory Committee on Mental Health, Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki has suggested that a joint meeting with the Panel on Health Services ("HS Panel") and the ED Panel should be held in the 2018-2019 session to discuss issues relating to mental health and related community support services and the work progress of the Advisory Committee.

Hon KWONG Chun-yu and Hon SHIU Ka-chun have suggested that service arrangements for Integrated Community Centres for Mental Wellness arising from extension of the scope of their service to cover all secondary school students should also be discussed under this item.

17. Youth suicides

Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki has suggested that the Panel should consider holding a joint meeting with the HS Panel on youth suicides and relevant social welfare organizations should be invited to give views thereon.

The monitoring of charitable fund-raising activities was covered in Public Accounts Committee Report No. 68 published in July 2017. A Government Minute, with details of the Government's responses, was tabled at LegCo on 18 October 2017.

33. Community development policy
