

# Securities and Futures Commission Approved budget of income and expenditure For the financial year 2019/2020



#### Introduction

- 1. The Securities and Futures Commission (SFC) submitted a detailed Budget of Income and Expenditure for the year 2019/2020 (the Budget) to the Administration for examination. Following such examination the Budget was approved by the Financial Secretary, under delegated authority from the Chief Executive, and presented by the Administration to the Finance Committee for information.
- 2. In accordance with Section 13(3) of the Securities and Futures Ordinance, the Budget as approved by the Financial Secretary is hereby submitted to be laid on the table of the Legislative Council.
