Council meeting of 13 November 2019

Debate and voting arrangements for the 11 proposed resolutions to repeal/amend the Prohibition on Face Covering Regulation ("the Regulation")

Further to LC Paper No. CB(3) 107/19-20 issued on 11 November 2019, a table on the debate and voting arrangements for the captioned proposed resolutions is attached for Members' information.

- 2. Hard copy of the table (i.e. the Appendix to Part ID of the Script for the meeting) will be placed on Members' desks in the Chamber before the start of the meeting.
- 3. As the above proposed resolutions seek to repeal/amend the Regulation and are interdependent, the President has directed that **a joint debate** be held on the proposed resolutions. To assist Members in considering the proposed resolutions, I set out the relevant proceedings under which the President will:
 - (a) first call upon Hon HUI Chi-fung to speak and move his proposed resolution, and then propose the question on the proposed resolution to kick off the joint debate;
 - Hon (b) call Claudia MO, Gary FAN. upon Hon Hon Dennis KWOK. Hon Tanya CHAN. Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki, Hon Jeremy TAM, Hon CHAN Chi-chuen and Hon Alvin YEUNG to speak in this order, but they may not move their proposed resolutions at this stage;
 - (c) call upon the Secretary for Security ("S for S") to speak;

- (d) invite Hon WONG Ting-kwong, chairman of the subcommittee formed to scrutinize the Regulation, to speak;
- (e) invite other Members to speak;
- (f) call Hon Claudia MO, Hon Gary FAN, upon KWOK. Hon **Dennis** Hon Tanya CHAN. Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki. Hon Jeremy TAM, Hon CHAN Chi-chuen and Hon Alvin YEUNG to speak again in this order;
- (g) call upon S for S to speak again;
- (h) call upon Hon HUI Chi-fung to reply, and order that the joint debate come to a close; and
- (i) put to vote the 11 proposed resolutions.
- 4. Members are invited to note that each Member may only speak once in the above joint debate and the time limit is 15 minutes. As mentioned in paragraph 3(f) and (h) above, movers of the proposed resolutions will have another opportunity to speak again with the time limit also set at 15 minutes before the proposed resolutions are put to vote. The public officer will not be subject to any speaking time limit.

Proposed resolutions to repeal/amend the Prohibition on Face Covering Regulation Debate and voting arrangements

The Prohibition on Face Covering Regulation ("the Regulation") which was made by the Chief Executive in Council under section 2(1) of the Emergency Regulations Ordinance (Cap. 241) seeks to:

- (a) prohibit the use in certain circumstances of any facial covering that is likely to prevent identification and provide for an offence (with a defence where the person charged with the offence had lawful authority or reasonable excuse at the time of the alleged offence);
- (b) empower a police officer to require a person in a public place to remove the person's facial covering in certain circumstances and provide for non-compliance to be an offence; and
- (c) provide for an extension of the prosecution time limit for the above offences to 12 months beginning on the date on which the offences are committed.
