Background brief on the Professional Services Advancement Support Scheme

Purpose

This paper provides background information on the Professional Services Advancement Support Scheme ("PASS"). It also summarizes the views expressed by members of the Panel on Commerce and Industry ("the Panel") during previous discussions on the subject.

Background

- 2. The Administration has been promoting the development of the professional services sector¹ on various fronts, including improving market access of Hong Kong's service sectors to world economies through trade agreements and marketing Hong Kong's service providers outside Hong Kong through proactive promotion programmes.
- 3. In 2002, the Administration set up the Professional Services Development Assistance Scheme ("PSDAS"), with an approved commitment of HK\$100 million,² to enhance the standards and external competitiveness of Hong Kong's professional services sector against a backdrop of opportunities

According to the Administration, the services sector is the driving force of Hong Kong's economic growth and accounted for around 93% of the gross domestic product ("GDP") in 2018. Being a high-value component of the services sector, professional services include areas such as accounting, architecture, legal and dispute resolution, engineering, business consulting and information technology. In 2017, professional services accounted for 4.7% of GDP and provided over 221 000 jobs.

The Finance Committee approved the setting up of a HK\$100 million Professional Services Development Assistance Scheme on 11 January 2002.

brought by the opening up of the Mainland market following China's accession into the World Trade Organization in 2001, and challenges from the restructuring of the local economy.

4. PSDAS had been concluded in 2015 but the Administration saw the need to continue supporting the professional services sector in their outreaching and enhancement efforts through a funding scheme, so as to assist the sector in tapping opportunities and meeting challenges ahead.

Professional Services Advancement Support Scheme

- 5. Against the above background, the then Chief Executive announced in the 2016 Policy Address that the Government would allocate HK\$200 million to support the professional services sector in enhancing exchanges and cooperation with the Belt and Road countries and other regions outside Hong Kong (including the Mainland), and promote related publicity activities.
- 6. Subsequent to the funding approval from the Finance Committee ("FC") in July 2016, the HK\$200 million PASS was launched in November 2016 to support Hong Kong's professional services sector to carry out worthwhile projects to spearhead proactive outreaching promotion efforts and to improve service offerings. Non-profit-distributing organizations operating as support organizations, trade and industrial organizations, professional bodies or research institutes, which shall either be statutory organizations or organizations formed or registered under the laws of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, are eligible to apply for funding under PASS.
- 7. PASS provides funding support for non-profit-making projects which are aimed at:
 - (a) increasing the exchanges and cooperation of Hong Kong's professional services with their counterparts in external markets;
 - (b) promoting relevant publicity activities; and
 - (c) enhancing the standards and external competitiveness of Hong Kong's professional services.

Activities relating to exchanges, cooperations and publicity are encouraged in particular. The maximum amount of PASS grant for an approved project is 90% of the total eligible project cost, or HK\$3 million, whichever is lower. Projects should normally be completed within three years.

8. A Vetting Committee ("VC") has been set up to consider the applications

received under PASS, recommend on the level of funding support and monitor approved projects. VC is chaired by a non-government official and comprises members drawn from or are knowledgeable about the professional services sector and include ex-officio members. The first batch of funded projects has been rolled out since mid-2017. Particulars of all the funded projects are listed in **Appendix I**.

Previous discussions

9. The Administration briefed the Panel on the proposed setting up of PASS at the Panel meeting on 21 June 2016 and sought FC's approval at the meeting on 12 July 2016. Members' views and concerns are summarized in the ensuing paragraphs.

Eligible professional services

- 10. At both meetings, members noted that according to the list of professional services eligible for funding under PASS as stated in the Administration's paper tabled at the meetings, items related to information technology ("IT") were classified under the category of "Others". They suggested that the Administration should revise the classification to cover various areas of IT services (e.g. fintech and information security) and to reflect the importance of the IT sector appropriately. VC should also include professionals from the IT sector.
- 11. The Administration advised that fintech and information security were included in information communications technology services and would be supported by PASS. The Administration would continue to reach out to major professional bodies and other stakeholders to exchange views on the implementation of PASS and planned to review the cost effectiveness, funding principles and modus operandi of PASS two years after its implementation.

Market

- 12. At the meeting on 12 July 2016, FC members enquired whether the professional sectors might only explore markets in the Mainland or the countries along the Belt and Road under projects funded by PASS; and the respective proportion of funding to be granted to professional sectors for exploring Mainland and overseas markets. Members also asked whether the Administration had assessed the way forward for professional sectors to explore new markets in the future.
- 13. The Administration advised that the professional sectors would play a leading role in the scheme and it would not require the funded organizations to

promote their services in any specific market. The proportion of funding in respect of Mainland and overseas markets would depend on the details of the projects approved in the end. Projects funded under PSDAS that involved the Mainland market accounted for about 10% of the total funded projects.

Latest position

14. The Administration will brief the Panel on 17 December 2019 on the progress of implementation of PASS and the way forward.
