(1) The annual subvention provided by the Government to Hospital Authority (HA) has included the resources required for the provision of medical benefits to civil service eligible persons (CSEPs). The expenditure calculated on the basis of attendances by CSEPs using HA services and the average unit cost of service provision in the past five financial years are set out in the table below:

(2) Apart from the annual lump sum provision, the Government also provides dedicated funding to HA to enhance the provision of services for CSEPs, including provision of dedicated SOP services at 9H Specialist Clinic (9HSC) in the Prince of Wales Hospital (PWH), L Block of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital (QEH) and Saturday SOP Clinic in the Queen Mary Hospital (QMH), as well as diagnostic services at the Block G Imaging Centre in QEH. Between 2014-15 and 2017-18, the annual dedicated funding amount to around \$83 million. In 2018-19, the dedicated funding has increased to around \$87 million to extend the service hours of Magnetic Resonance Imaging and introduce mammographic service at the Block G Imaging Centre in QEH.

(3) Statistics on the utilisation of HA's GOP, SOP, A&E and inpatient services by CSEPs in the past five financial years are set out in the table below:
