Dear Chairman and Members,

The Finance Committee of the Legislative Council is asked to approve a 5.025bln budget for Cyberport 5.

We urge Members to reconsider giving budget approval. There are EIGHT concerns which have yet to be resolved:

- 1. Cyberport Expansion Project will result in:
 - a. Permanently granting the entire popular 6.5ha waterfront park to Cyberport; and
 - b. Loss of more than 20% of the park area with construction of a building and access road.
- 2. Cyberport has yet to seek approval of a Master Layout Plan for the new building as required under the Town Planning Ordinance (budget implications unknown);
- 3. Cyberport and Innovation and Technology Bureau declined the invitation to discuss the project with the Southern District Council on 18 May 2021. It has yet to agree with the community on the enhancements of the waterfront park (budget implications unknown);
- 4. Cyberport failed to mitigation for the loss of the park such as adding a waterfront walkway to Sandy Bay, and constructing a cover for shade over the existing pier area (budget implications unknown);
- 5. Enhancements (para 15) including repaving the existing promenade, re-laying the turf, and adding petfriendly facilities, are in fact maintenance requirements which fall short of community requests for new facilities;





- 6. The claim that (para 5) "occupancy rates are consistently at high levels of 90% and 95%" appears exaggerated note empty space, empty desks, and the many non-tech companies enjoying cheap rents. Hon Ma Fung-kwok, GBS, JP pointed this out in the ITB Panel meeting on 10 May 2021;
- 7. There is no need for a physical data centre at Cyberport. There is no evidence that access to cloud storage is "limited and costly" (para 7). In any case, data centres should be placed at industrial sites, not at precious waterfront land. Hong Kong Stock Exchange places its data centre in Tseung Kwan O Industrial Estate, not at the Central Waterfront;
- 8. The claim that "the largest conference facility in Cyberport at present can only accommodate a maximum of 300 persons" appears false as the Arcade offers a large venue with 500 seats and a 6.6 meter by 5.4 meter 4K LED screen. This was funded with \$100 million in the 2018 Budget.

Should the Members of the Legislative Council be inclined to support the funding application, we urge for the following conditions:

- A. Approval of the Master Layout Plan by the Town Planning Board;
- B. Agreement with community including District Council on new facilities and enhancements of the park;
- C. Government to raise a separate budget to extend the park with a waterfront walkway to Sandy Bay.

The Annex sets out popular requests made by residents for enhancement of the Cyberport Waterfront Park to mitigate for the loss due to Cyberport Expansion Project.



Dear Messrs. Chan and Sit,

My background includes more than 15 years as an equity analyst covering the property and retailing sectors for Goldman Sachs and Standard Chartered and I also have tech start-up experience, but I am writing to you as a concerned Pokfulam resident.

I am alarmed by reports that the Finance Committee will be voting today to authorise an injection of HKD 3,834 million (plus loan guarantees of HKD 1,191 million) for the development of Cyberport 5. I urge you to postpone the vote until additional due diligence on Hong Kong Cyberport Development Holdings Limited's financial results and tenant roster can be conducted.

Based on my professional experience, my primary concern is that HKCDHL created the office supply shortage at Cyberport (and one of the main justifications for Cyberport 5) by leasing office space at belowmarket rents to companies that do not need to be at Cyberport and offering generous rental concessions to companies.

For example, why are FedEx and Microsoft and countless other non-tech companies on the tenant roster? Allow the markets to function, and let these bigger companies relocate to other areas (where there is sufficient supply), or at a minimum charge them an appropriate market rent. In addition, The Arcade (Cyberport's retail podium) is underutilised and should generate much higher rental income if repurposed or property managers were permitted to upgrade the tenant roster.

As a Pokfulam resident, I am also very concerned that areas that have been available for public use at Waterfront Park would be permanently lost if Cyberport 5 goes forward, and residents are being offered nothing in return. This is in addition to the disruption to traffic during and after the construction period, in an area where public transportation options are already poor and unreliable.

Pokfulam District Councillor Paul Zimmerman has proposed some enhancements to the Cyberport waterfront. I hope the Finance Committee can ensure there is funding for these enhancements in the budget. Families with young children and pet owners from all across Hong Kong already visit Waterfront Park due to its greenery and fresh air. I still recall my first visit to Waterfront Park with my infant son more than a decade ago. Losing part of the Waterfront Park will be a loss to all Hong Kong residents. Hong Kong Island is one of the most beautiful islands in the world. It deserves a world-class waterfront and protection of green spaces.

Thank you very much for your time. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions. I am available to support the Finance Committee in a pro bono capacity should you want a formal independent review of HKCDHL's proposal.

I refer to the imminent review for approval of the HK\$5.025 B budget for Cyberport 5

I wish to strongly beseach you to delay approval of the aforementioned budget.

I attended the TPB meeting on 5th June 2020 and was frankly dismayed by the lack of meaningful exploration as to the need for this expansion.

The matrix by which the ITB claims that the existing Cyberport infrastructure is a success and therefore warrants expansion are flawed and wholly inadequate. Their claim that the facilities are full misses the point. Office space is rented out to all

mannner of companies who have little to do with technology (I for a fact know of one hedge fund based there). Rents are low based on any sensible comparative criteria and so it appears that the HKCMCL is basically in a race to the bottom.

HKCMCL refused in the aforementioned meeting to provide details of average rental rates paid *inclusive* of sweetners such as rent-free periods.

Meanwhile peppercorn rents are offered in the Arcade in a pathetic attempt to show "full tennancy". Honorary Chairman, there have literally been second hand carpet sellers renting space at the arcade. Amongst the population of Pok Fu Lam, the Arcade is considered little more than a bad joke.

A far more thorough and forensic analysis of the criteria by which HKCMCL and the ITB can claim Cyberport is a success and therfore deserving of expansion must be made.

Finally, and to all ressidents dismay, despite promises given on 05th June 2020, no Master Layout Plan with detailed drawings has yet been provided for public view.

Sir, kindly delay approval of this budget until residents real concerns are scrutinized and the HKCMCL

My wife and I have lived in Pokfulam since 1988.

I refer to the above Paper to be discussed this afternoon by the Finance Committee. I wholly endorse Mr. Paul Zimmerman's excellent letter to you and your fellow Members dated 10th June 2021 setting out his various concerns.

I have worked closely with Mr. Zimmerman for many years to improve Pokfulam. One area both Mr. Zimmerman and I have been very keen on is to create paths away from traffic. A very significant number of people run and walk on Victoria Road next to the busy traffic. As an alternative to running/walking on Victoria Road, it would be wonderful, as compensation for losing part of Cyberport park if, as suggested by Mr. Zimmerman a walkway could be constructed between Cyberport and Sandy Bay (similar to the very popular walkway between Deepwater Bay and Repulse Bay). This walkway would not only be for Pokfulam residents but for all Hong Kong residents and visitors. I do hope that all of Mr. Zimmerman's concerns will be fully considered by the Finance Committee this afternoon.

Dear Hon Chan Kin-por, Mr. Alfred Sit Wing Hang and Mr. Peter Yan,

I'm a resident in Pokfulam, a parent of two children at The ISF Academy (adjacent to Cyberport), and a very frequent user of Cyberport Park (particularly the area being developed into Cyberport 5).

District Councillor Mr. Paul Zimmerman and his staff have kept our community aware of the progress and development at Cyberport and I frequent the facilities as well.

I compliment those responsible for the improvements to the facilities in the past few years. People are working hard to make Cyberport a center of innovation and technology.

The park created with the cancellation of a planned highway is popular within the community. During these past years dealing with the virus the park has served Hong Kong well as an open space. The park attracts people from near and far to enjoy it's wide open spaces.

Mr. Zimmerman raises eight concerns. These should be examined. He is an advocate for Pokfulam residents, park users and those who wish to enjoy the outdoors with paths connecting the seafront.

The wide open space that will be lost with the footprint of the building should be recreated into the water adjacent to the new building.

That space should be designated as 'park forever' to alleviate fears it would become a building site in the future.

I appreciate the effort that goes into creating the Cyberport 5 project. One can create the best conditions to attract capable people to innovate but, then they must come.
