Action

I. Confirmation of minutes of meeting

Minutes of 3rd meeting held on 30 October 2020

(LC Paper No. CB(2)138/20-21)

The minutes were confirmed.

II. Matters arising

Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration

2. <u>The Chairman</u> said that Members' concerns on various issues expressed at the last meeting of the House Committee ("HC") held on 30 October 2020 had been relayed to the Chief Secretary for Administration ("CS"). CS had responded that Members could propose issues of concern for discussion by the relevant Panels, and also raise their views and discuss with the relevant bureaux.

- 3. <u>Dr KWOK Ka-ki</u> criticized CS for not directly responding to issues raised by Members at previous HC meetings, notably the incident of 12 Hong Kong people being arrested by the Mainland authorities. He also expressed concern about the arrest of CHOY Yuk-ling, a producer of Radio Television Hong Kong, by the Police a few days ago on suspicion of making false declarations when conducting vehicle registration searches. To his understanding, the case was related to the change to the requirement made by the Transport Department in relation to the declarations for the purposes of such searches, and therefore, the relevant issues were related to various bureaux and departments such as the Security Bureau and the Transport and Housing Bureau. <u>Dr KWOK</u> requested that CS be invited to attend a special HC meeting for discussion of the relevant issues relating to the aforesaid case as well as other issues raised by Members at previous HC meetings.
- 4. Mr KWONG Chun-yu said that at the last HC meeting, he had asked the Chairman to relay to CS his suggestions regarding relief measures for members of the public hard-hit by the epidemic. He wondered whether CS had made any response, adding that he considered it imperative for the Administration to provide cash pay-out for members of the public, and to establish funds to support small and medium-sized enterprises as well as individuals. Mr KWONG requested that CS be invited to attend a special HC meeting to discuss the above issues with Members.
- 5. Mr SHIU Ka-chun was dissatisfied that he and 18 other Members and some District Council members had jointly written to CS on 2 November 2020 expressing concern about the suspension of official visits by Members to persons in custody, but he had not received any reply from CS. He considered that CS should ask the Correctional Services Department to resume the relevant arrangements for official visits, and to reply to the joint letter.
- 6. The Chairman said that while CS had not responded specifically to the issues raised by individual Members, CS had all along attached importance to the concerns expressed by Members at HC meetings. She believed that CS was already well informed of those issues raised by Members and would ask the relevant bureaux to follow up. The Chairman further said that as the 18 Panels had gradually commenced their work in the 2020-2021 session, issues of concern to Members could be submitted to the relevant Panels for follow-up. She also believed that for cross-bureau issues which were of great importance, CS would brief

Members on those issues if appropriate in due course. <u>The Chairman</u> added that the Panel on Health Services would discuss the subject on the prevention and control of coronavirus disease 2019 in Hong Kong at its meeting scheduled for next week.

III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

(a) Legal Service Division report on bill referred to the House Committee in accordance with Rule 54(4)

Supplementary Appropriation (2019-2020) Bill (LC Paper No. LS8/20-21)

- 7. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Legal Adviser</u> ("LA") briefed Members on the report prepared by the Legal Service Division ("LSD") on the above Bill.
- 8. <u>Mr James TO</u> considered it necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. Mr James TO agreed to join the proposed Bills Committee.
- (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 30 October 2020

(LC Paper No. LS6/20-21)

- 9. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>LA</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on the Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) (No. 4) Regulation 2020 (L.N. 212) which was gazetted on 30 October 2020 and tabled in Council on 4 November 2020.
- 10. <u>Mr James TO</u> considered it necessary to form a subcommittee to study the above Regulation in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the subcommittee: Mr James TO, Dr KWOK Ka-ki, Dr Helena WONG (as advised by Mr James TO) and Dr Pierre CHAN.
- 11. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending the above Regulation would be the Council meeting of 2 December 2020, or that of 6 January 2021 if extended by a resolution of the Council.

IV. Further business for the Council meeting of 11 November 2020

Report No. 2/20-21 of the House Committee on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation and Other Instruments

- 12. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the above draft Report, which covered subsidiary legislation the period for amendment of which would expire at the Council meeting of 11 November 2020, had been issued to Members.
- 13. The Chairman further said that as a Member had indicated his intention to speak on the Rating (Exemption) Order 2020 (Amendment) Order 2020, she would, in her capacity as the HC Chairman, move a motion to take note of the Report in relation to the Order at the meeting.

18. <u>The Chairman</u> invited Members to note the list tabled at the meeting (LC Paper No. CB(3)95/20-21), which contained three items of subsidiary legislation the period for amendment of which would expire at the Council meeting of 18 November 2020. She reminded Members to indicate their intention by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, 10 November 2020, should they wish to speak on any of those items of subsidiary legislation.

VI. Position on Bills Committees and subcommittees

(LC Paper No. CB(2)139/20-21)

19. <u>The Chairman</u> said that as at 5 November 2020, there were two Bills Committees, 22 subcommittees under HC and one subcommittee on policy issues under a Panel in action. Seven subcommittees on policy issues were pending activation.
