### I. Confirmation of minutes of meeting

## II. Matters arising

# Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration

The Chairman said that the newly appointed Chief Secretary for 2. Administration ("CS") had written to her on the day he assumed office (i.e. 25 June 2021) indicating that he would endeavour to enhance the relationship between the Executive Authorities and the Legislature and maintain effective communication and close liaison with the Legislative Council ("LegCo"). CS had also mentioned in his letter that he would cooperate with LegCo in fulfilling its constitutional responsibility to monitor the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and would make concerted efforts with LegCo in striving to safeguard the overall interests of Hong Kong and in serving all the people The Chairman further said that she had already replied of Hong Kong. to CS that she had the same expectations. She had also mentioned in her reply that in order to facilitate LegCo's effective conduct of scrutiny work, she hoped that CS would coordinate various policy bureaux to carry out the communication and explanatory work properly, and to listen to the views of Members from various political parties and groupings prior to presenting any bills or proposed items to LegCo. The Chairman added that the letter from CS and her reply had been issued to Members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)1237/20-21 and LC Paper No. CB(2)1243/20-21 respectively.

# III. Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 25 June 2021

(LC Paper No. LS86/20-21)

3. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Legal Adviser</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by the Legal Service Division on three items of subsidiary legislation (i.e. L.N. 104 to L.N. 106) which were gazetted on 25 June 2021 and would be tabled in Council on 7 July 2021.

- 4. <u>Mr Christopher CHEUNG</u> considered it necessary to form a subcommittee to study the Financial Institutions (Resolution) (Contractual Recognition of Suspension of Termination Rights Banking Sector) Rules (L.N. 106) in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the subcommittee: Ms Starry LEE, Mr Christopher CHEUNG, Mr Holden CHOW and Mr CHEUNG Kwok-kwan.
- 5. Members did not raise any questions on L.N. 104 and L.N. 105.
- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending the above three items of subsidiary legislation would be the Council meeting of 21 July 2021, or that of 25 August 2021 if extended by a resolution of the Council.

## IV. Further business for the Council meeting of 7 July 2021

- 8. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the House Committee ("HC") would consider the above two Bills at its meeting on 9 July 2021.

9. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the purpose of the above proposed resolution was to extend the period for amending the Telecommunications (Registration of SIM Cards) Regulation to the Council meeting of 18 August 2021.

A draft Report of HC on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation and Other Instruments covering these four items of subsidiary legislation would be issued to Members later. She reminded Members to indicate their intention by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, 6 July 2021, should they wish to speak on any of those items of subsidiary legislation.

16. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Chief Executive's Question and Answer Session would be held from 10:30 am to 12:00 noon.

## VII. Reports of Bills Committees and subcommittees

# Report of the Subcommittee on Two Proposed Resolutions under Section 3(1) of the Loans Ordinance

- 17. Mr Holden CHOW, Chairman of the Subcommittee, made a verbal report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee. He said that the objectives of the two proposed resolutions under section 3(1) of the Loans Ordinance (Cap. 61) were to seek LegCo's approval to raise the respective maximum amounts of borrowings under the Government Bond Programme ("GBP") and the Government Green Bond Programme ("GGBP") to HK\$300 billion or equivalent and HK\$200 billion or equivalent.
- 18. Mr CHOW further said that the Subcommittee had held one meeting and had completed the scrutiny work of the two proposed resolutions. Members of the Subcommittee generally supported the proposal to raise the borrowing limits under the two bond programmes.

- 19. Mr CHOW advised that some members of the Subcommittee had pointed out that under the current extremely low interest rate environment, the Administration should consider further raising the borrowing limit under GBP, so as to issue more bonds to finance the Government's major infrastructure projects. In addition, given that the government bonds issued in recent years were very well received by the public, some members of the Subcommittee had suggested that a sufficient share in GBP should be reserved for subscription by retail investors to meet the demand from the retail market. In respect of promoting the development of the Hong Kong bond market, some members of the Subcommittee had enquired whether the Administration would consider securitizing bonds, allowing securities brokers to participate more in the sale of retail bonds, and issuing more Renminbi bonds.
- 20. Mr CHOW further advised that the Administration had responded that currently it had not set limits for the proportion of the issuance of institutional and retail bonds under GBP and the currency denomination of these bonds, and the Government would give due consideration to market conditions. In recent years, the Government had issued the inflation-linked retail bonds and Silver Bond through the retail part of GBP to foster the development of the retail bond market and provide members of the public with an investment choice of steady return. The Government had also set up a steering group to study the measures that could further promote the development of the bond market in Hong Kong. The securitization of bonds would be among the issues to be explored.
- 21. Mr CHOW also advised that regarding GGBP, some members of the Subcommittee had suggested that the Administration should regularly report to the public the environmental benefits brought by the funded projects. The Administration had advised that the quantifiable positive environmental impacts of the projects funded by GGBP would be set out in detail in the green bond report to be published by the Government annually.
- 22. Mr CHOW informed Members that the Administration had indicated its intention to give fresh notice to move the two proposed resolutions at the Council meeting of 21 July 2021. The Subcommittee would not propose any amendments to the two proposed resolutions and would submit a written report in due course.
- 23. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for giving notice of amendments, if any, to the above two proposed resolutions which were intended to be moved at the Council meeting of 21 July 2021 would be Wednesday, 14 July 2021.

#### VIII. Position on Bills Committees and subcommittees

(LC Paper No. CB(2)1239/20-21)

24. <u>The Chairman</u> said that as at 30 June 2021, there were five Bills Committees, seven subcommittees under HC and nine subcommittees on policy issues under Panels in action.
