### I. Confirmation of minutes of meeting

#### Minutes of 28th meeting held on 2 July 2021

(LC Paper No. CB(2)1262/20-21)

#### **II.** Matters arising

## **Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for** <u>Administration</u>

2. The Chairman said that at her last meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration ("CS"), CS had indicated that he would render full support to the Chief Executive in the administration of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in accordance with the Basic Law to ensure comprehensive and accurate implementation of the "one country. two systems" principle and the concept of "patriots administering Hong Kong". CS had further indicated that he would allocate more time to liaise with various Legislative Council ("LegCo") Members with a view to jointly enhancing the relationship between the Executive Authorities and the Legislature. The Chairman further said that CS also agreed with the views put forward in her reply letter and would encourage various policy bureaux to step up communication with Members and carry out the explanatory work properly prior to presenting bills and funding proposals to LegCo, and also to cooperate with LegCo in its monitoring of the work of the Government. The Chairman also advised that CS had remarked that he would be pleased to listen to the views of Members on different issues and would attend meetings of the House Committee ("HC") at an opportune time to exchange views on issues of common concern and respond to Members' questions.

#### III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

- (a) Legal Service Division reports on bills referred to the House Committee in accordance with Rule 54(4)
  - 1. Securities and Futures (Amendment) Bill 2021 (LC Paper No. LS88/20-21)

3. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Legal Adviser</u> ("LA") briefed Members on the report prepared by the Legal Service Division ("LSD") on the above Bill. <u>LA</u> said that LSD was scrutinizing the legal and drafting aspects of the Bill.

4. <u>Members</u> considered it not necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill. <u>LA</u> advised that LSD would make a further report if necessary.

2. Limited Partnership Fund and Business Registration Legislation (Amendment) Bill 2021 (LC Paper No. LS87/20-21)

5. At the invitation of the Chairman,  $\underline{LA}$  briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on the above Bill.

6. <u>Mr Holden CHOW</u> considered it necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the Bills Committee: Ms Starry LEE, Dr Junius HO, Mr Holden CHOW and Mr CHEUNG Kwok-kwan.

## 3. Organized and Serious Crimes (Amendment) Bill 2021 (LC Paper No. LS90/20-21)

7. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>LA</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on the above Bill.

8. <u>Members</u> considered it not necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill and did not raise objection to the resumption of the Second Reading debate on the Bill.

#### (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 2 July 2021 (LC Paper No. LS89/20-21)

9. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>LA</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance (Public Pleasure Grounds) (Amendment of Fourth Schedule) (No. 2) Order 2021 (L.N. 108) which was gazetted on 2 July 2021 and tabled in Council on 7 July 2021.

10. <u>Members</u> did not raise any questions on L.N. 108.

11. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending the above item of subsidiary legislation would be the Council meeting of 21 July 2021.
