I. Confirmation of minutes of meeting

2. The Chairman said that there was nothing special to report.

III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

(a) Legal Service Division report on bill referred to the House Committee in accordance with Rule 54(4)

National Flag and National Emblem (Amendment) Bill 2021 (LC Paper No. LS110/20-21)

- 3. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Legal Adviser</u> ("LA") briefed Members on the report prepared by the Legal Service Division ("LSD") on the above Bill.
- 4. <u>Dr Priscilla LEUNG</u> considered it necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the Bills Committee: Dr Priscilla LEUNG, Mrs Regina IP, Mr Steven HO, Mr CHAN Han-pan, Dr CHIANG Lai-wan, Mr Holden CHOW, Mr CHEUNG Kwok-kwan, Mr LAU Kwok-fan and Mr Tony TSE.
- (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 13 August 2021

5. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>LA</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on 15 items of subsidiary legislation (i.e. L.N. 147 to L.N. 161) which were gazetted on 13 August 2021 and tabled in Council on 18 August 2021.

- 6. <u>Mr CHAN Han-pan</u> considered it necessary to form a subcommittee to study the Road Traffic (Driving Licences) (Amendment) Regulation 2021 (L.N. 154) in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the Subcommittee: Mr CHAN Han-pan, Ms Elizabeth QUAT (as advised by the Chairman), Dr CHIANG Lai-wan, Mr CHEUNG Kwokkwan and Mr LUK Chung-hung.
- 7. <u>Members</u> did not raise any questions on the other 14 items of subsidiary legislation (i.e. L.N. 147 to L.N. 153 and L.N. 155 to L.N. 161).
- 8. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending the above items of subsidiary legislation would be the Council meeting of 15 September 2021, or that of 6 October 2021 if extended by a resolution of the Council.

12. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Supplementary Appropriation (2020-2021) Bill would be presented to the Council at the meeting, and the House Committee ("HC") would consider the Bill at its meeting on 3 September 2021.

- 15. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>LA</u> briefed Members on the report prepared by LSD on the above proposed resolution.
- 16. <u>Members</u> did not raise any questions on the proposed resolution and had no objection to the Administration moving the proposed resolution at the Council meeting of 1 September 2021.

(d) Member's Motion

Motion on "Resolving social conflicts and eradicating disparity between the rich and the poor" to be moved by Hon Alice MAK (LC Paper No. CB(3)887/20-21)

17. The Chairman invited Members to note that the Secretariat had issued a circular on the day before this HC meeting to inform Members that Dr Priscilla LEUNG, who was allocated a debate slot for moving a motion at the Council meeting of 1 September 2021, had decided to give up her debate slot after the deadline for giving notice of motion. As such, only one motion not intended to have legislative effect moved by Ms Alice MAK would be dealt with at the meeting. The Chairman reminded Members that the deadline for giving notice of amendments, if any, to the above motion would be Wednesday, 25 August 2021.

Report of HC on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation and Other Instruments

18. The Chairman invited Members to note that there was one item of subsidiary legislation the period for amendment of which would expire at the Council meeting of 1 September 2021. A draft Report of HC on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation and Other Instruments covering this item of subsidiary legislation would be issued to Members later. She reminded Members to indicate their intention by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, 24 August 2021, should they wish to speak on that item of subsidiary legislation.

VI. Reports of Bills Committees and subcommittees

Report of the Subcommittee on Peak Tramway (Safety) (Amendment) Regulation 2018 (Commencement) Notice

19. Mr CHAN Kin-por, Chairman of the Subcommittee, made a verbal report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee. He said that the Subcommittee had completed scrutiny of the Commencement Notice. The Commencement Notice appointed 17 December 2021 as the day on which the Peak Tramway (Safety) (Amendment) Regulation 2018 would come into operation. The purposes of the Amendment Regulation were to amend the definition of "tramcar" under the Peak Tramway (Safety)

Regulations (Cap. 265A) and increase the tramcar capacity from a maximum of 120 passengers to 210 passengers, so as to implement the upgrading plan for the peak tramway.

- 20. Mr CHAN further said that members of the Subcommittee supported the upgrading plan for the peak tramway. However, they were mainly concerned about the financial arrangements for the upgrading plan, the peak tramway fares, and the relevant ancillary and supporting arrangements, etc. upon completion of the upgrading plan. According to the Administration and the Peak Tramways Company Limited, the upgrading plan was wholly funded by the Peak Tramways Company Due to the pandemic, there had been delays and additional expenditure incurred under the upgrading plan. The entire project currently costed over HK\$700 million and was targeted to complete by the end of 2021. As the Lower Terminus at Garden Road could accommodate 1 300 waiting passengers after expansion, and the tramcar capacity would also be increased to 210 passengers, queues waiting for peak trams would not build up under normal circumstances. The Administration also explained that as the peak tramway was a tourism and recreational facility, it would be more appropriate for the market to decide on the peak tramway fares.
- 21. <u>Mr CHAN</u> informed Members that the Subcommittee would not propose any amendments to the Commencement Notice and would submit a written report in due course.
- 22. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the period for amending the Commencement Notice would expire at the Council meeting of 1 September 2021, and that the deadline for giving notice of amendments, if any, would be Wednesday, 25 August 2021.

VII. Position on Bills Committees and subcommittees

(LC Paper No. CB(2)1380/20-21)

23. <u>The Chairman</u> said that as at 19 August 2021, there were 10 Bills Committees, five subcommittees under HC and eight subcommittees on policy issues under Panels in action.
