He considered it unfair that candidates whose nominations were determined invalid in the discontinued 2020 LegCo General Election were not eligible for receiving the Government's payment in respect of declared election expenses.</li> </ul>	
		The Administration explained the rationale for postponing the 2020 LegCo General Election and the eligibility criteria for receiving the Government's payment in respect of declared election expenses. It added that any election deposit lodged to the Returning Officers for the 2020 LegCo General Election would be returned to the candidates, regardless of whether they were validly nominated.

The Administration advised that its attendance list for the meeting had been endorsed by SCMA. The Legal Adviser to the Subcommittee reiterated that neither the Rules of Procedures nor House Rules had any provision which empowered a committee of LegCo to require any specific public officers to attend its meetings.

The Administration reiterated that if the Registration and Electoral Office ("REO") found any <i>prima facie</i> evidence of abuse in any election returns, such cases would be referred to the Independent Commission Against Corruption for investigation. In response to Mr LAM's further enquiry, the Administration clarified that any election donations would be counted as election expenses when spent/used.

The Administration advised that in preparing for the said election, it would strive to improve the existing electoral arrangements (e.g. to consider the feasibility of providing dedicated queues for elderly electors), closely monitor the development of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") epidemic, and formulate various plans in view of the different possibilities in a timely manner.	
002235 - 003759	Chairman Mr Steven HO Deputy Chairman Ms Elizabeth QUAT Mr Charles MOK Admin	Mr Steven HO, the Deputy Chairman and Ms Elizabeth QUAT raised concerns about the possibilities of candidates' making fraudulent and abusive claims for Government payments in respect of declared election expenses incurred at or in connection with the discontinued 2020 LegCo General Election. They enquired how REO would determine whether the election expenses declared by candidates in their election returns (including the costs of in-kind donations received as declared by the candidates) were reasonable and genuine.	
		Mr Charles MOK pointed out that in accordance with the electoral law, all candidates had all along been required to submit election returns after the

		election to rigorously declare all the election expenses incurred by them. He raised concern that since the election expenses incurred by candidates in connection with the 2020 LegCo General Election would be reimbursed, candidates who declared their election expenses in a rigorous way might run the risk of being seen as abusing the system or making fraudulent claims. Mr MOK was also concerned that candidates who received the relevant payments might have an advantage should they run for the 2021 LegCo General Election and re-use the procured materials/services in the rallying activities.	
		The Administration advised that the definition of "election expenses" was stipulated in the Elections (Corrupt and Illegal Conduct) Ordinance (Cap. 554). The declared election expenses could not exceed the limits as specified in the Maximum Amount of Election Expenses (Legislative Council Election) Regulation (Cap 554D). The reporting requirements regarding election expenses and receipt of donations under Cap.554 remained unchanged and were applicable to the discontinued 2020 LegCo General Election. After REO received the election returns from candidates, it would carefully check the election returns to ascertain whether all the election expenses and donations received had been properly declared in the election returns submitted by candidates. If necessary, candidates would be required to provide proofs (e.g. invoices, receipts and the products concerned in physical form) to facilitate REO's verification. REO would also make reference to the market prices of the products concerned where appropriate.

Given the exigency of the epidemic situation and sensitivity of election matters, public health experts had not been consulted on the Regulation.
