Policy Briefing – Supplementary Information

(a) Animal Welfare

The number of suspected animal cruelty reports received by the Police and the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department and relevant prosecutions made over the past three years are tabulated as follows:

(b) Public Columbarium

The Government is determined to increase the supply of public niches. Under the district-based columbarium development scheme, a total of 24 potential sites have been identified in the 18 districts for columbarium development. Various factors are taken into account in seeking to build columbaria in individual districts, including topographical conditions, land use compatibility, infrastructural support, traffic and environmental implications, and the concerns of residents in the vicinity of the proposed sites. Regarding the development of funeral facilities in the North District, the Sandy Ridge Cemetery, which was established in Lo Wu, New Territories as early as in 1950, has long been providing funeral services for the public. The Sandy Ridge Cemetery is also one of the potential sites under the district-based columbarium development scheme. The plan to build facilities including columbarium, Garden of Remembrance, crematorium and funeral parlour in Sandy Ridge Cemetery only involves areas within the existing cemetery, and several rounds of district consultation have been conducted. The Government will incorporate greening elements in the cremation facilities and the funeral parlour to be built in the valley and utilise the topographical features and terrains to minimise the impacts of the facilities on the scenery.

The project is being implemented in phases. In particular, the site formation and associated infrastructure works for development of columbarium commenced in 2017 and will be completed in 2021, involving an investment of over \$1.8 billion. If the Sandy Ridge Project could not be implemented as planned, the short, medium and long-term funeral service supply in Hong Kong will be significantly affected.
