11. Outcome of the public consultation on the proposed amendments to the Chinese Temples Ordinance

The Panel discussed the outcome of the Review on the Chinese **Temples** Ordinance (Cap. 153) 24 March 2015 and held a special meeting on 5 May 2015 to receive public views on the subject. noted that the Administration was conducting a public consultation exercise ending on 12 May 2015. outcome of the public consultation will be considered recommendations together with the Audit Commission made in Report No. 68 on the management of Chinese temples and comments of the Public Accounts Committee.

To follow up on the review, in 2016, the Chinese Temples Committee established a Review Task Force which would consult various stakeholders when appropriate. HAB will report to the Panel the outcome of the review after concrete discussion results have been achieved.

12. Review of Places of Public Entertainment Ordinance

At the request of the Subcommittee on Places of Public Entertainment (Exemption) (Amendment) Order 2011, the Administration undertook to convey members' concern and suggestions on reviewing the Places of Public Entertainment Ordinance (Cap. 172) ("PPEO"), including narrowing down the scope of "public entertainment" and "place of public entertainment" policy therein. the relevant bureaux to The Subcommittee agreed that issues consideration. relating to the review of PPEO should be referred to the Panel for follow-up. Members' views and the Administration's response on the subject were detailed in paragraphs 27 and 28 of the Subcommittee's report [LC Paper No. CB(2)1152/11-12].

At the Panel meeting on 10 October 2013, Hon Cyd HO advised that according to a recent ruling of the Court of Appeal, dance performance in the pedestrian precinct did not trigger the licensing requirements under PPEO. She suggested that the Panel should follow up on issues arising from the court judgment when the review of PPEO was discussed.

At the Panel meeting on 27 February 2017, members agreed to follow up on the issues raised in the submission provided by the Hong Kong Theatres Association Ltd. [LC Paper No. CB(2)852/16-17(01)] regarding the licensing and operation of the cinema industry, which includes a request for review and updating of PPEO.

The case mentioned by the former Hon Cyd HO had been put before the Court of Final Appeal. The Court of Final Appeal's ruling had clarified the interpretation of the definition of "places of public entertainment" in PPEO. Since then, the Government has been issuing Places of Public Entertainment Licences and handling the relevant licensing matters in accordance with the interpretation in the ruling.

The Administration is studying the Hong Kong Theatres Association Ltd's proposal to extend the maximum validity period of the licence and has been in communication with the cinema trade. The Administration will report to the Panel as appropriate when there is specific progress.

13. Matters relating to the funding for and the governance of major performing arts groups

At the Panel meeting on 24 March 2015, some members expressed concerns about the governance of the Hong Kong Chinese Orchestra. Members agreed that the Panel should discuss the Government's subvention policy for major performing arts groups ("MPAGs") and monitoring of MPAGs' performance in complying with the requirements set out in the Funding and Services Agreements which HAB had entered into with each of the MPAGs.
