<b>1.</b>	<b>Report on the new mental health initiatives and work of the Advisory Committee on Mental Health</b>	2 <sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2022

At the Panel meeting on 10 January 2020, in the context of discussing the enhancement of mental health services, members were briefed on, among others, the work progress of the Advisory Committee on Mental Health since its establishment in December 2017, the commencement of three mental health prevalence surveys by two local universities as commissioned by the Administration in 2019, and the Dementia Community Support Scheme.

Dr KWOK Ka-ki\* proposed vide his letter dated 21 October 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)161/20-21(01)) that the Panel should discuss in the 2020-2021 legislative session the review of mental health services, including policy relating to persons with dementia.

Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG proposed vide his letter dated 22 October 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)161/20-21(02)) that the Panel should discuss in the 2020-2021 legislative session the mental health status of the Hong Kong population under the epidemic, and the enhancement and support measures in this regard.

At the meeting between the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Panel and Secretary for Food and Health ("SFH") to discuss the Panel's work plan for the 2020-2021 session on 9 November 2020, the Administration advised that it planned to provide members with an update on the subject in the second half of 2021.

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<p><b>2. Update on tobacco control measures</b></p> <p>Item proposed by the Administration. The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the progress of tobacco control measures with a view to achieving a smoking prevalence of 7.8% by 2025 as promulgated under "Towards 2025: Strategy and Action Plan to Prevent and Control Non-communicable Diseases in Hong Kong".</p>	2 <sup>nd</sup> half of 2022
<p><b>3. Development of primary healthcare services and setting up of DHC Express</b></p> <p>Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan proposed vide her letter dated 2 November 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)161/20-21(03)) that the Panel should discuss the subject in the 2020-2021 legislative session. She further suggested vide her letters dated 12 March and 18 May 2021 (LC Paper Nos. CB(4)640/20-21(01) and CB(4)1010/20-21(01)) that the Panel Chairman should arrange for discussion of the subject as soon as possible. The Administration's responses to Dr CHIANG's letters were issued to members on 12 April and 2 July 2021 respectively vide LC Paper Nos. CB(4)754/20-21(01) and CB(4)1191/20-21(01).</p>	1 <sup>st</sup> quarter of 2022
<p><b>4. Review of dental care services and relevant manpower plan</b></p> <p>The subject covers: (i) review of dental care services, (ii) provision of dental services for adult patients with intellectual disability and with financial needs and (iii) review of oral health goals. Discussion of the subject was originally scheduled for the regular meeting of the Panel on 11 December 2020. Subsequently, it was announced in the Chief Executive's 2020 Policy Address that all the staff establishment proposals awaiting scrutiny would be withdrawn and subject to individual review. 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2020 that discussion of the subject would be deferred to a future meeting.

- 5. Accident and emergency service provided by the Hospital Authority ("HA") and responses taken by HA in relation to mass gathering and confrontation incidents in the community** To be confirmed

This subject covers: (i) accident and emergency service provided by HA, (ii) handling of public requests for emergency medical needs within the vicinity of public hospitals, and (iii) responses taken by HA in relation to mass gathering and confrontation incidents in the community.

- 6. Procedure in organ transplant** To be confirmed

Hon CHAN Han-pan proposed vide his letter dated 28 August 2015 (LC Paper No. CB(2)2062/14-15(01)) that the Panel should discuss issues relating to an organ donation and transplantation incident in the Prince of Wales Hospital whereby it was found that the donor had renal cell carcinoma after the carrying out of the heart and lungs transplantations. The Chairman instructed that the subject of procedure in organ transplant be included in the Panel's list of outstanding items for discussion.

Dr Hon Pierre CHAN proposed vide his letter dated 2 May 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(2)1323/16-17(01)) that the Panel should discuss at the earliest possible time issues relating to organ donation and transplant.

- 7. Regulation of pharmaceutical products** To be confirmed

Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki proposed vide his letter dated 9 October 2015 (LC Paper No. CB(2)2229/14-15(01)) that the Panel should discuss issues relating to the monitoring of the unauthorized sale of pharmaceutical products and invited views from deputations on the subject. The Chairman instructed that the subject be

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included in the Panel's list of outstanding items for discussion.

Dr Hon Helena WONG proposed via her letter dated 29 November 2018 (LC Paper No. CB(2)373/18-19(01)) that the Panel should discuss the management and testing of pharmaceutical products. The Chairman instructed that the subject be included in the Panel's list of outstanding items for discussion. In response to the request made by Dr Hon Helena WONG in the letter, the Administration has provided for members' reference an information paper on the regulation and testing of pharmaceutical products (LC Paper No. CB(2)502/18-19(01)).

At the special meeting on 21 October 2019, Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Panel should discuss the emergence of suspected counterfeit vaccines in the market.

- 8. Review of the Human Reproductive Technology Ordinance (Cap. 561)** To be confirmed

The item was referred to the Panel for follow-up by the Bills Committee on Human Reproductive Technology (Amendment) Bill 2015.

During the scrutiny of the Bill, the Administration has advised that it would work with the Council on Human Reproductive Technology ("CHRT") to look into the need to amend the Human Reproductive Technology Ordinance comprehensively having regard to the stakeholders' feedback and the operating experience of CHRT. The Administration undertook to keep the Panel informed of the progress.

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<p><b>9. Provision of one-stop services for victims of sexual violence in and prevention of crime in psychiatric wards of public hospitals</b></p>	To be confirmed
<p>This subject was originally placed on the Panel's list of outstanding list for discussion as two separate items (viz. (i) Provision of one-stop services for victims of sexual violence in public hospitals and (ii) Prevention of crime in psychiatric wards of the HA hospitals). In November 2019, the two items were merged as suggested by the Administration.</p>	
<p><b>10. Provision of atrial fibrillation screening</b></p>	To be confirmed
<p>Hon KWONG Chun-yu proposed via his letter dated 13 November 2018 (LC Paper No. CB(2)257/18-19(01)) that the Panel should hold a meeting to receive views from members of the public on measures for stroke prevention, including the provision of atrial fibrillation screening.</p>	
<p>Dr Hon CHIANG Lai-wan proposed vide her letter dated 2 November 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)161/20-21(03)) that the Panel should discuss the subject in the 2020-2021 legislative session.</p>	
<p><b>11. Specialist services, non-emergency services and examinations provided by HA</b></p>	To be confirmed
<p>At the meeting on 11 October 2018, Hon CHAN Han-pan suggested that the Panel should discuss in the 2018-2019 session the specialist services provided by HA.</p>	
<p>Dr KWOK Ka-ki* proposed vide his letter dated 21 October 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)161/20-21(01)) that the Panel should discuss in the 2020-2021 legislative session measures to shorten the waiting time for specialist outpatient services, non-emergency services and examinations provided by HA.</p>	

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<b>12. Pilot Accredited Registers Scheme for Healthcare Professions</b>	To be confirmed
<p>The Panel held a special meeting to receive views from members of the public on the subject on 10 December 2018. The Administration advised at the meeting that the Accreditation Agent announced the accreditation results for the speech therapist and audiologist professions in April and November 2018 respectively, and expected to announce the accreditation results for dietitian and educational psychologist professions in phases by the first quarter of 2019. Separately, the accreditation process for the clinical psychologist profession has commenced. Upon completion of the accreditation, the Accreditation Agent will review the effectiveness of the Pilot Scheme and report to the Administration with recommended measures for improvement. The Administration would study how to formulate a statutory registration regime for relevant accredited professions based on the Pilot Scheme.</p>	
<b>13. Good Samaritan law for first aid given in bona fide medical emergency</b>	To be confirmed
<p>At the meeting on 19 November 2018, Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki suggested that the Panel should discuss the subject at the earliest possible time in the 2018-2019 session.</p>	
<b>14. Implementation of the regulatory regime under the Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance (Cap. 633)</b>	To be confirmed
<p>The item was referred to the Panel for follow-up by Subcommittee on Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance (Specification of Date for Section 135(1)(a)) Notice and Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance (Specification of Date for Section 136(1)(a)) Notice.</p>	
<p>In the course of scrutinizing the two Notices, the Administration has, in response to members' request,</p>	

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undertaken to brief the Panel on a yearly basis on the progress made towards the full implementation of the new regulatory regime under the Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance.

At the policy briefing on 21 October 2019, members were advised that the application period for licences for private hospitals started on 2 July 2019, and that for day procedure centres would commence on 2 January 2020. For clinics, applications for licences and requests for letters of exemption would commence in 2021 the earliest.

- 15. Corporate governance and manpower situation of HA and the use of the additional funding earmarked in the 2019-2020 Budget for HA's work concerning its manpower, drug treatments and medical equipment** To be confirmed

This subject was originally placed on the Panel's list of outstanding list for discussion as two separate items (viz. (i) Corporate governance and manpower situation of HA and (ii) Progress report on the use of the additional funding earmarked in the 2019-2020 Budget for HA's work concerning its manpower, drug treatments and medical equipment). In November 2019, the two items were merged as suggested by the Administration.

- 16. Maintenance of professionalism in service delivery by healthcare professionals in public hospitals** To be confirmed

At the special meeting on 21 October 2019, Hon Starry LEE, Dr Hon Priscilla LEUNG, Hon CHAN Han-pan and Hon Elizabeth QUAT suggested that the Administration and HA should brief the Panel on measures in place to ensure the healthcare professionals' professionalism in the delivery of services in public hospitals in the light of their participation in mass gathering activities taken place in hospital premises.

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At the meeting between the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Panel and SFH to discuss the Panel's work plan for the 2019-2020 session on 29 October 2019, the Administration was requested to provide a written response to members' concerns in this regard to facilitate the Panel's consideration of how the matter should be followed up. The Administration's response has been issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)148/19-20(01) on 7 November 2019.

**17. End-of-life care: Legislative proposals on advance directives and dying in place**

To be confirmed

At the meeting on 8 November 2019, the Panel was briefed on the public consultation on the subject being conducted for the period from 6 September to 16 December 2019. The Administration was requested to revert to the Panel on the results of the public consultation when available.

At the meeting on 13 December 2019, the Panel received views from deputations on the subject.

The Administration provided an information paper on the outcome and way forward of the above public consultation exercise in July 2020. The paper has been issued to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)1388/19-20(01) on 24 July 2020.

**18. Effectiveness of the internal auditing mechanism of DH and HA**
