- 1. Enactment of legislation against insulting police officers** To be confirmed

Item proposed by Hon Michael TIEN and Hon Elizabeth QUAT at the meeting on 28 October 2016. Hon Elizabeth QUAT proposed the discussion of the item again in her letter dated 21 October 2020 (LC Paper No. CB(2)75/20-21(01)).

At the work plan meeting of the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman with the Secretary for Security on 8 November 2016, the Administration was requested to provide a paper regarding its views on the subject. The Administration's paper was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2189/16-17 on 10 October 2017.

- 2. Manpower shortage of disciplined forces** To be confirmed

The Administration originally intended to brief the Panel on upgrading the post of Principal Immigration Officer (Enforcement) to Senior Principal Immigration Officer rank (Directorate D1 rank) for enhancing the enforcement strategy in combatting immigration crimes. This proposal will be withdrawn as with other staff establishment proposals of the Government as announced in the 2020 Policy Address. The Administration proposes the item be deleted.
