Explanatory Note

This Notice amends Schedule 5 to the Disability Discrimination Ordinance (Cap. 487) (*Ordinance*).

- 2. The effect of the amendment is that the provision of fare concessions to certain persons with a disability in respect of a public transport service is a further exception to Parts 4 and 5 of the Ordinance if the service is operated by a holder of a passenger service licence that—
 - (a) authorizes the operation of a public bus service; and
 - (b) is issued in respect of a public bus operated for the purposes of a residents' service.
- 3. Under section 60 of the Ordinance, the discrimination referred to in paragraph 2 is not rendered unlawful by Parts 4 and 5 of the Ordinance.
