Proposed Work Plan

Introduction

This paper sets out the proposed work plan on taking forward the Advance Decision on Life-sustaining Treatment Bill (the Bill) for Members' consideration.

- 3. After completion of the clause-by-clause examination, the Administration would prepare Committee Stage Amendments for discussion with the Bills Committee in June 2024. If all goes well, the Bills Committee deliberation would be completed thereafter and the resumption of the second reading of the Bill could take place in the second quarter of 2024.
- 4. Noting that the Bill entails substantial operational aspects (e.g. making and revocation) of AMDs and DNACPR orders, we recommend commencing the Ordinance after allowing adequate time for medical institutions, relevant policy bureaux and departments and other related organisations to draw up or revise protocols, records and systems, and provide training to their staff.
