Amendment to Hon Rock CHEN's motion on "Integrating associations of Chinese fellow townsmen into the district governance systems"

Further to the email (LC Paper No. CB(3)142/2023) issued on 2 March 2023, the President has given permission for Hon YIM Kong to move an amendment to Hon Rock CHEN's motion, and has directed that the amendment be printed in the terms in which it was handed in on the Agenda of the Council.

- 2. The President will order a joint debate on the above motion and the amendment. I set out below the relevant proceedings in which the President will:
 - (a) call upon the motion mover to speak and move the motion;

 - (c) call upon the Member who wishes to move an amendment to the motion to speak, but no amendment is to be moved at this stage;
 - (d) call upon the public officer(s) to speak;
 - (e) invite other Members to speak;
 - (f) call upon the motion mover to speak on the amendment;

- (g) call upon the public officer(s) to speak again;
- (h) invite the amendment mover to move his amendment and forthwith propose and put to vote the question on the amendment; and
- (i) call upon the motion mover to reply, and then put to vote the question on the motion, or the motion as amended, as the case may be.

The mover(s) of the amendment(s) and other Members may each speak once up to a maximum of five minutes.

That, as the key supporters of 'loving the country and Hong Kong', associations of Chinese fellow townsmen have long been serving clansmen and residents in districts and playing a role in fostering cohesion and unity in the community; in this connection, this Council urges the SAR Government to support integrating associations of Chinese fellow townsmen into the district governance systems, appoint outstanding individuals from the associations to district consultative bodies, promote better liaison and cooperation between District Offices and the associations, appropriately allocate resources to encourage the associations to launch district services, and support volunteers from the associations to participate in District Services and Community Care Teams, so that the associations can provide appropriate and targeted services to clansmen.

That, associations of Chinese fellow townsmen, having the resources advantages of the Mainland, can support the SAR Government's district work; as the key supporters of 'loving the country and Hong Kong', associations of Chinese fellow townsmen have long been serving clansmen and residents in districts and playing a role in fostering cohesion and unity in the community; in this connection, this Council urges the SAR Government to support integrating associations of Chinese fellow townsmen into the district governance systems, appoint outstanding individuals from the associations to district consultative bodies, promote better liaison and cooperation between District Offices and the associations, facilitate more cooperation among the associations to support the SAR Government's district work, appropriately allocate resources to encourage the associations to launch district services, and support volunteers from the associations to participate in District Services and Community Care Teams, so that the associations can provide appropriate and targeted services to more clansmen and residents, with a view to building a better home together and promoting the achievement of good governance in Hong Kong.
