South Lantau Eco-recreation Corridor (Development Bureau)	28 May 2024	Some members consider that the Administration should capitalize on the natural scenery of Hong Kong and give play to innovative thinking (e.g. introducing activities that provide exciting experience for tourists at relevant tourist spots) to enhance the tourism appeal of Hong Kong. In this connection, the Administration was requested to provide information relating to the regulation of activities such as parasailing and ziplining, including the government departments responsible for regulating such activities.
