**Council meeting of 2 July 2025**

**Amendments to Hon Doreen KONG's motion on  
“Developing a personal data protection regime framework to address  
the challenges in the age of artificial intelligence”**

The President has given permission for three Members (Hon LAM San-keung, Hon Duncan CHIU and Ir Hon LEE Chun-keung) to move amendments to Hon Doreen KONG's motion. The terms of the original motion and the marked-up version of the amendments (LC Paper No. CB(1)1093/2025(01)) are **attached** for Members' information.

2. The President will order a joint debate on the above motion and the amendments. I set out below the relevant proceedings in which the President will:

- (a) call upon the motion mover to speak and move the motion;
- (b) propose the question on the motion;
- (c) call upon the Members who wish to move amendments to the motion to speak in the following order, but no amendment is to be moved at this stage:
  - (i) Hon Duncan CHIU;
  - (ii) Hon LAM San-keung; and
  - (iii) Ir Hon LEE Chun-keung;
- (d) call upon the public officer(s) to speak;

- (e) invite other Members to speak;
- (f) call upon the motion mover to speak on the amendments;
- (g) call upon the public officer(s) to speak again;
- (h) deal with the amendments in the order set out in paragraph (c) above, i.e. first invite the mover of the first amendment to move the amendment and forthwith propose and put to vote the question on the amendment, and thereafter proceed to deal with the remaining amendment(s); and
- (i) after all amendments have been dealt with, call upon the motion mover to reply, and then put to vote the question on the motion, or the motion as amended, as the case may be.

3. Members are reminded that in accordance with Appendix IIIA to the House Rules, the **maximum duration of this joint debate (including voting) is four hours**. The motion mover will have a total of 10 minutes to make introductory speech and reply (paragraph 2(a) and (i) above refers), and another five minutes to speak on the amendment(s) (paragraph 2(f) above refers). The mover(s) of the amendment(s) and other Members may each speak once up to a maximum of five minutes.

**1. Hon Doreen KONG’s original motion**

That in the face of the opportunities and challenges that artificial intelligence (‘AI’) technology may bring to the economy, politics and society, Hong Kong needs to develop a personal data protection regime framework that suits its own social development status, while having regard to the greatest common ground internationally and global leadership; in this connection, this Council urges the SAR Government to improve the personal data protection regime framework and implement the ‘people-centred’ and ‘AI-for-good’ concepts of governance, so as to address the challenges in the age of AI.

**2. Motion as amended by Hon Duncan CHIU**

That *technological innovation is a key factor in enhancing international competitiveness*; in the face of the opportunities and challenges that artificial intelligence (‘AI’) technology may bring to the economy, politics and society, Hong Kong needs to develop a personal data protection regime framework that suits its own social development status, while having regard to the greatest common ground internationally and global leadership; in this connection, this Council urges the SAR Government to improve the personal data protection regime framework ~~and~~, implement the ‘people-centred’ and ‘AI-for-good’ concepts of governance, *and work towards the objective of building and improving a community with a shared future in cyberspace*, so as to address the challenges in the age of AI.

That in the face of the opportunities and challenges that artificial intelligence (‘AI’) technology ~~may bring~~ *brings* to the economy, politics and society, Hong Kong needs to develop a personal data protection regime framework that suits its own social development status, while having regard to the greatest common ground internationally and global leadership; in this connection, this Council urges the SAR Government to improve the personal data protection regime framework, *balance AI development with the rights and interests relating to*

*personal data*, and implement the ‘people-centred’ and ‘AI-for-good’ concepts of governance, so as to address the challenges in the age of AI.
