Improving the trade union regulatory regime	24 February 2025	The Administration was requested to provide supplementary information to clarify whether imported workers who were permitted to work in Hong Kong but resided outside Hong Kong could serve as promoters for new union registration applications; if so, whether the trade unions concerned were entitled to the same statutory rights as trade unions formed by local foreign domestic helpers and other trade unions, such as the right to participate in relevant local elections.	Response from the Administration awaited.
2. Protection for digital platform workers	24 March 2025	The Administration was requested to provide supplementary information on the insurance currently taken out by food delivery digital platforms for platform workers, together with comparisons with the statutory employees' compensation under the Employees' Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 282).	Response from the Administration awaited.

The updated Talent List	28 April 2025	<p>The Administration was requested to provide the following supplementary information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(a) whether consideration would be given to removing the two professions of “midwives” and “chiropractors” from the Talent List having regard to the results of the Healthcare Manpower Projection 2023; and(b) the number of Chinese medicine practitioners who had applied and been granted approval to come to Hong Kong under the talent admission schemes to which the Talent List applied; and whether such applicants were already qualified to practise in Hong Kong; if not, what measures the Administration had put in place to prevent those Chinese medicine practitioners who had been granted entry approval but had yet to be registered from practising in Hong Kong.
