Results of 1996 consultation

Summary of Public Response to the Consultation Paper on the Draft Reproductive Technology Bill

The Provisional Council on Reproductive Technology conducted a two-month public consultation from July to September 1996 on the following three major issues arising from the draft Reproductive Technology Bill -

- (a) sex selection achieved by means of reproductive technology (RT) procedures;
- (b) use of fetal ovarian or testicular tissue in infertility treatment or in research; and
- (c) the licensing system.
- 2. The consultation exercise attracted 41 written responses, including those from medical professionals and professional bodies, social service groups, religious bodies and academic institutions and organisations involved in the practice of reproductive technology. Only four responses were from members of the public. The Wong Tai Sin District Board also discussed the consultation paper. An overall analysis of these responses is at <u>Annex A</u>. A total of 15 public views were also collected from a call-in radio programme "Heart of the Matter" and articles/editorials published in newspaper. An analysis of these is at <u>Annex B</u>.
