#### **Information Paper**

#### Physical Education Facilities for Primary and Secondary Schools

In reviewing a number of educational issues in Hong Kong, Education Department takes notes of the importance of promoting children's physical development in their school education.

- 2. Education Department, based on the "School Education in Hong Kong: A Statement of Aims" published by the Education Commission in September 1993, affirms that physical development of pupils is one of the main aims of school education. Following this aim, school buildings have been designed to provide adequate physical education facilities and activity space as far as practicable to help children build up strong physique, make good use of their leisure time and develop an interest in physical activities.
- 3. Government has been improving the provision of physical education facilities and activity space to schools in the past few decades. Please refer to Appendix I for details. In the latest design ('year 2000' design) for primary and secondary schools, we will provide at least two basketball courts and one multi-purpose area. For details of physical education and sports facilities in primary and secondary schools with 30 classrooms adopting the latest standard design, please see Appendix II.
- 4. Owing to constraints in land resources, it is difficult to identify suitable school sites in densely populated urban areas. Education Department has taken appropriate adjustments in planning new school projects to balance

the needs of various parties and to ensure that activity space for pupils will not be reduced. For example, smaller scale primary schools, with 18 or 24 classrooms, will be erected on smaller sites; sub-standard secondary school sites will be used for construction of primary schools; the height of school building is extended as far as Buildings Ordinance and Fire Services Ordinance permit to reduce site coverage of school buildings so that more open space can be spared for physical activities; and putting one more basketball court on the top of the school hall etc.

- 5. For the large number of old design schools not constructed to the current standard, Education Department has initiated the School Improvement Programme based on the recommendations of Education Commission Report No. 5, to provide additional facilities or redevelop the school premises where feasible so as to bring their facilities up to the latest standard including the provision of more activity space for pupils.
- 6. As regards further training for Physical Education teachers, Physical Education Section of the Education Department conducted a series of training courses in the 97-98 and 98-99 school years. For details, please refer to Appendix III and IV. Most of the courses took place in primary and secondary schools. Some were held in teachers' centres and other sports organisations. In the coming year, Education Department with co-operate with Hong Kong Medical Association to conduct first aid workshops in hospitals. The Advisory Inspectorate Division of Education Department will continue to carry out inspections in schools at regular intervals and in response to teachers' needs, co-operate with relevant organisations to provide appropriate in-service

training courses for Physical Education teachers to ensure that quality physical education training is offered to students in primary and secondary schools.

7. In addition to the delivery of formal Physical Education lessons, Education Department in collaboration with relevant organisations, continues to organise a number of sports training courses and competitions for pupils in order to motivate pupils' interest and participation in physical activities. Details of relevant activities in the 97-98 school year are at Appendix V.
